Chief Campbell said such programs as the anti-drug use elementary school program DARE, high school liaison and other initiatives could be threatened.

This, like station closings, is at the bottom of the list and Chief Campbell says there is no expectation that these programs will be cut this year.

Again on the revenue side, substantial funds may be realized if the force implements a Highway Traffic Act diversion program: Traffic offenders are issued a ticket that allows them to attend a safety lesson at a police station and pay \$50 to Halton Regional Police. As a result, the ticket would be nullified and no demerit points deducted.

This program has been approved in Kingston, but has yet to be implemented.

Chief Campbell said fees for false alarms are also being studied.

In addition, he said the service is looking into actively marketing home and business safety inspections, which are currently conducted on an irregular basis. Chief Campbell said they may also market firearm safety courses.

## Ontario Government Notice Toll Highway 407 Notice of Public Information Session South of Britannia Road to Highway 410

Canada's first all-electronic Toll Highway 407 is being developed through a unique public-private partnership between the Government of Ontario, through the Ontario Transportation Capital Corporation, and Canadian Highways International Corporation. The new partnership will complete Highway 407 sooner than originally planned and at a significant savings through value engineering and efficiencies of scale. Canadian Highways is contracted to develop, design, build, operate and maintain the Toll Highway for a 35 year period. Construction has been underway by Canadian Highways since May 13, 1994 at a number of sites between Highway 401 and CNR Uxbridge (west of Kennedy Road, Markham).

Canadian Highways is holding Public Information Sessions for the components of Toll Highway 407 to provide opportunities for area residents and other interested parties to view design plans and discuss the program with Canadian Highways' representatives. We encourage you to attend in order to view the displays and provide comments.

The first Public Information Session was held in November 1994, for Highway 407 from Highway 410 to Highway 427 and from Centre Street to Leslie Street. A second Public Information Session was held in February 1995, for Highway 407 from east of Leslie Street to west of CNR Uxbridge. The third Public Information Session was held in November 1995, for Highway 407 (west of Highway 410) 1995/96 winter works structures and culverts. The fourth Public Information Session was held in March 1996, for Highway 407 from CNR Uxbridge (west of Kennedy Road, Markham) to Highway 48. The following is the schedule for the fifth Public Information Session:

Comments received will become part of the public record, and may be included in the study documentation. A subsequent Public Information Session will be held for Highway 407 from Highway 403 to South of Britannia Road.

Highway 407 design projects follow earlier planning studies, design engineering and public consultation for Highway 407, including public hearings through the Parkway Belt West Planning Study. The planning, design, construction and operation of Highway 407 from Highway 403 to Highway 48, have been exempted from the requirements of the Environmental Assessment Act by Exemption Order MTC-52 (dated 1993).

General information on Toll Highway 407 is available at the Public Information Centre located at 8308 Bathurst Street, Thornhill, just south of Highway 7. Visiting hours are from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. (Telephone: (905) 709-4869; Contact: Isabelle Frati)
