The win came as a huge shock to most fans and parents, as the 'Canes had won only nine games all season and finished eighth in the 10 team loop. "We won more games in the playoffs this year than we did during the entire regular season," Wells explained.

He said a championship run at artournament in Windsor just after the regular season ended provided a huge boost to the players' confidence level. From there, they took down Guelph, Stoney Creek and St. Catharines before squeezing by Oakville.

"We were the underdogs in every series we played. Not too many teams that finish eighth in a 10-team division end up winning it all. This is truly unbelievable." added Wells.

While Holmes provided the bulk of the offense during the playoffs —including 11 points in the semifinal series with St. Catharines — Halton got key production fourth overall.
