Via Rail has spruced up its act by introducing new 'Silver Trains' on its Windsor-Toronto and Niagara Falls-Toronto run. A smoother, more comfortable ride is promised with better temperature control and lighting.

A train trip to Windsor to do some gambling takes one along a 140 year old route first started by the Great Western Railway. Its a three and one half hour trip from-Toronto travelling through Oakville, Burlington, Brantford, Woodstock, London and Chatham plus many railside hamlets of the past.
