

Major novice Hawks put in solid effort Golden girl

The major novice "AA" Winterhawks turned in some solid efforts in tournament play recently, but failed to reach the championship round at the London Invitational.

Milton got off to a great start with a 4-0 shutout win over the host London crew, with star netminder Corey Clarkson stoning the opposi-

tion and gaining MVP honors to boot.

Jamie Webb, Evan Burrell, Greg Pepper and Robbie Wilson registered goals in game one, with assists posted by Jackson Gair and Nathan Keith.

The Hawks ended up on the other side of a shutout in game two, falling

2-0 to Alderton. Their opponents went ahead early in the first and locked up the win with an empty net goal in the final three seconds of play.

Anchoring a solid effort for Milton were Webb and Justin Deshaw.

In a must-win situation to advance to the final round, the Hawks pulled

out all the stops in game three but were edged 3-2 by Owen Sound.

Counting goals were Gair and Mark Galick while Wilson and Daniel Lynch were particularly impressive in their last game.

The major novices ended the season with a 2-2 tie against West Mall in Etobicoke.

In the Pre-Novice 1, 10-year-old category, Heather Gibb — another first-year competitor — turned in a personal best performance on vault for the bronze, her first medal of the season. She also earned sixth place on beam.

Teammate Alexis Stoffels put in a solid effort on beam to take fifth place, as well as capturing sixth on floor. Head coach Janet Campbell was very happy with the results of her newest additions to the competitive team.

"These girls were so poised and self-confident. They didn't make a single error, which is exceptional for first-year competitors."

Eleven-year-old Katherine Russell performed a flawless beam routine, earning a bronze medal in the Novice 1 category and a first time visit to the podium in her competitive career. She also received a fifth place finish on floor and was sixth on bars.

In the highly competitive category of Novice 2, 11-year-old Jessica Deshaw took fifth on bars, seventh on floor and eighth on both vault and beam, combining for an eighth all around finish. Teammate Alicia Robinson was plagued with sore wrists and had to take out some of her more difficult skills in various events. Despite injury, she did perform an exceptional vault to score 8.0 out of a possible 8.5.

"These were the best results of the year," said coach Campbell. "In fact, the best in several seasons. The girls have been a pleasure to coach at meets."

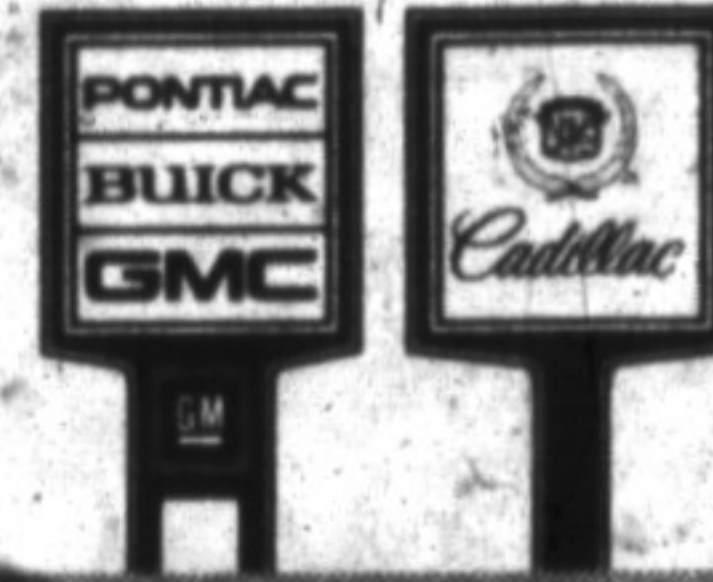
