"You have to listen - take time to sit with them. Life becomes more meaningful for them then. It's so comfortable just to know someone is there."

Ms Anglin and Ms Duncan offer their services on a monthly, weekly, daily or that's needed, they're willing to go to the nursing home or the hospital and provide

If it's accompaniment to a medical or dental appointment that's required, they'll provide that service as well and will also offer their time as a companion on trips and journeys.

"I have heard so many elderly people in wheelchairs say, 'Shirley, I would love to go on a trip' but because of the inconvenience of getting on a plane or going on a trip, they don't," says Ms Duncan. This is something we could do for the elderly."

Special training for facility staff is also an area they would like to delve into, given the opportunity.

"We also have the capability to provide specialized sensitivity training in psychosocial, cultural and other issues for residential staff."

Their services can be customized to blend with each client's personal situation. They can supervise clients in a structured day program or plan and implement stimulating activities specific to the client's needs. They'll also provide one-on-one supportive counselling.

To ensure the service is attentive and special, Ms Duncan says they're willing to take on only three clients each at the pre-

"We want this service to be meaningful,

not just running in and running out. We want it to be very special."

Because the need exists, Ms Anglin and Ms Duncan are trying to reach families whom they might be able to help.

"We're not really charging a lot of money because right now I don't think hourly basis. If it's simply companionship people can afford to pay much," Ms Duncan says.




