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Field Trips

Field trips are an important part of our programme. During our four years of operating the school, we have taken the whole school on hikes to conservation areas, including Black Creek Village; the younger children have visited the R.O.M. and Ontario Place, as well as the zoo, the Science Centre, the Marine Museum, Fort York, Queens Park, and Burlington Airport; the grade 6-8's have seen, and completed studies on "Les Miserables", and "Phantom of the Opera", and have been to Ottawa and Quebec City, (we have actually run this latter trip twice now) and more recently, to Gettysburg and Washington, D.C.

We have had a two-day camp over (in tents), and spent a day in a laboratory at the University of Toronto working with microscopes, etc. (One of our parents is a professor at U of T, and he very kindly set up a whole day of activities for our students as well as introduced them to an

electron microscope.

Learning as a partnership

Our parents are important to us. We encourage parents with particular skills/expertise/interests, to help us to enhance the learning of our children. Indeed, one of the great strengths of Hitherfield is the vision of the school as an extended family, all members working together toward a common goal.

- Before registration is finalized, a child will have completed the prescribed program of immunization for diphtheria, tetanus, poliomyelitis, measles, mumps and rubella.
- Families registering for the first time at a school are requested to provide the child's medical card at the time of registration.
