• from CHAMBER on page 8 punt on Golden," Mr. Chudleigh said. "As we looked at governance we saw taxation became more and more of the problem."

He explained the government will shortly announce a study on the costs and funding of education, with an eye to introduce legislation by the fall of 1997. The major consideration of the study is provincewide pooling of commercial and industrial taxes, which would be redirected to fund the education system.

Tory projections for growth in the economy are very conservative, the Halton North MPP said. A downturn would not likely lead to a reinstitution of tax cuts, he added.

"I think our program could withstand a recession, though I'm not looking for one to happen," Mr. Chudleigh said.

Provincial policy is to clean up the entangled responsibilities of government, Mr. Chudleigh assured Milton's chief administrative officer David Hipgrave. He suggested provincial government costs won't shift to the property tax base, something local officials are worried about.
