



# One lucky hiker will drive instead

Somebody who takes part in the Sunday, May 26 Hike for Health won't have to do much hiking anymore.

That's because the lucky participant will win the use of a Chevrolet Cavalier for two years, courtesy of Richardson Chev Olds in Milton.

"We're busy. We're being stretched thinner all the time," he said.

On Wednesday, the officer spent a few hours outside Sam Sherratt School watching for motorists violating stop signs.

"It's surprising how many people blow stop signs completely," said Constable Dunham, who has spent the last five years in Milton uniformed patrol, except for a six-month stint in the Criminal Investigations Bureau. "It's amazing what being parked here does."

The notions of police handing out tickets to reach quotas or bring in revenue are ridiculous, he said.

Decisions on whether to charge drivers under the Highway Traffic Act are at the discretion of officers, who are more hesitant to give tickets than in previous years, he said.

Constable Dunham said police are more often considering the cost of driving offence fines and the jump in insurance premiums that follows, and are issuing more warnings in appropriate situations.
