Intermediate boys' participant Jon Webb was the other gold medalist for Wildcats in the triple jump, as well as fourth in the long jump. Shawn McConnell was third in the shot put. Ryan Sinanan and Adam Haller were the top finishers for the junior boys. with second place efforts in the 200m and shot put respectively.
