Saved best to last

Marques snares bronze in long jump at OFSAA championships

Bishop Reding Secondary School long jumper Shawnda Marques saved her best efforts until the very last moment Friday afternoon in Kitchener, and captured the bronze medal in the junior girls class at the All-Ontario high school championships.

One of five Royal tracksters to make the trip to the provincial finals — and one of 10 from Milton — Marques used her final leap to set a new school record of 5.33 metres in the junior girls long jump to take the

The jump marked BR's first-ever bronze medal at the Ontario Federation of Schools Athletic Association OFSAA track and field and the first provincial medal in field events.

It also marked a big improvement over both her Southern Ontario Regional leap (5.10m) and her finish at the Golden Horseshoe Athletic Conference (GHAC) finals of 5.18m.

She was just .03m away from scoring silver and .10m from winning outright.

E.C. Drury's Donrick Thomas was Milton's second best finisher this past weekend, with a fifth place showing in the midget boys high jump. He cleared

Fellow Drury participant Brooke Johnson failed to crack the top eight in the junior girls 800m. as she finished fourth in her heat with a time of 2.23 minutes.

Reding sprinter Matt Peers placed 11th in the junior boys 200m in 23.15 seconds and was 13th in the 100m, crossing the finish line in 11:31s.

Long-distance runner Carrie-Ann Nichols set a personal best and new school record of 5:11.96m in the midget girls 1,500m, which was good enough for 16th

Junior female Sarah Brownell took 12th in the 800m with a time of 2:24.70m while Danny Ferreira finished the midget boys 100m hurdles in 15:72s for 19th spot.

A trio of Milton District Mustangs were also part of the OFSAA finals.

Leading the way was junior male Kyle Garon, who was 10th in the long jump with a 6.14m leap. His personal best of 6.38 would have been good enough for fifth place.

Meanwhile, Lindsay Simpson had a personal best of :10.54m in the senior girls 400m hurdles and placed 16th while Rob Hans was 15th in the senior boys javelin (45.96m) and 17th in the shot put (13:01m).


