TAX NOTICE

Ratepayers of the Town of Milton are reminded that the first installment of the final 1996 tax bill is due on June 28,1996.

If you require information about taxes, please contact the Corporate Services Department at 878-7211 Ext. 147. 8:30 A.M. to 4:30 P.M., Monday through Friday.

Tax payments must be received in the corporate services office on or before the due date to avoid penalty. Late payment charge of 1 1/4% will be charged on the first day of default and on the first day of each calender month in which the default continues. It is the responsibility of the ratepayer to ensure that the taxes are paid by the due date, even in the event that the bill is not received as mailed.

Taxes may be paid:
