

### Scherer wants say in council size...

Currently candidates names are listed on ballots in alphabetical order.

"When it comes municipal government it is real simple," said Mr. Scherer. "The idea is to get a good product for the dollars you spend. For the last 10 years or so we've been getting a bad product and paying too much."

He called for a reduction of councillors

in the current Ward 2 area from four to two, and equivalent reductions to rural councillors.

"(Halton) Region was able to address this issue and reduce regional council," said Mr. Scherer. "It wasn't mandated by the province. The attitude has to change that you should wait for the province to tell you what should happen. Milton council doesn't have to wait and if they are going to, what do we need them for?"
