Woman stages bold early morning bank robbery at mall

A woman bank robber made off with a small amount of cash after holding up National Trust at Milton Mall Wednesday morning. The robber approached a teller with a note demanding money at 10:30 a.m., said Staff Sgt. Roy Smith of Halton Regional Police.

The teller handed over some cash, which the culprit put into a bag. She was last seen approaching the parking lot at the west end of the mall. No weapon was seen, Staff Sgt. Smith said.

The robbery happened quickly and quietly, according to one bank patron who didn't realize the heist had occurred.

"You didn't even know anything had gone on," said Mike Walsh, 18, who was meeting with a financial consultant and didn't see the robber.

Mr. Walsh found out the bank had been held up when the man-

ager began locking the doors while customers were still inside standard procedure during a robbery to protect the/crime scene.

The woman was white, well-tanned, in her late thirties wearing yellow sun visor, dark knee-length shorts and sunglasses. Anyone who may have seen the woman is asked to contact police at 878-5511, ext. 2115.

The robbery was the first bank heist in town this year.

Local patients may feel pinch

Medical services across the province are in peril and Milton is no exception, says the head of the Halton Medical Society.

Dr. Garnet Maley, society president, says medical care is going downhill due to government cutbacks, and if the trend continues, local patients will feel the effects.

"There are some doctors in town that are very dismayed by what's happening," says Dr. Maley, a family physician who operates a practice in town.

He says doctors continue to earn less money and growing frustration will prompt them to simply stop providing some services that "are not worth the time or the aggravation."

The local physician's comments coincide with last week's call by the Ontario province's health care system Medical Association (OMA) for the Mike Harris government to take immediate action to avoid what it calls an "imminent crisis in medical care
