



Milton man charged after a two-car crash, three people injured

A Milton man faces several charges, including impaired driving, following a two-car crash in Burlington.

Three people were injured in the collision at the intersection of Fairview Street and Maple Avenue shortly before midnight Saturday. The crash occurred after a car ran a red light, Halton Regional Police said.

A passenger in one of the vehicles broke an arm and leg, police said. Details of the other injuries were not available, however they were described as not life threatening.

Charged with dangerous driving, driving with over the legal limit of alcohol in his blood and three counts of impaired driving causing bodily harm is a 19-year-old Milton man.

Developers get more room for growth from Halton

Halton council agreed recently to release more sewage capacity to some Milton developers late next year.

Negotiations with local developers resulted in two "slight" changes to the proposed bylaw according to Joe Rinaldo, Halton's commissioner of corporate services.

Mr. Rinaldo explained to council the changes were not alterations in policy, rather, they were clarifications made to satisfy the development industry.

"If developers don't require a (bigger sewage) connection they are not subject to the surcharge," Mr. Rinaldo told council. He also explained that landowners with current approvals will pay additional development charges only when they exceed their current water limits.

Mr. Rinaldo told council that developers were relatively satisfied with the bylaw.

"Under a 1980 agreement they (land interests in Milton's High Point Business Park) have an allowance for (sewage and water) capacity," said Mr. Rinaldo. If they exceed that capacity they pay. We've done

this for years. It's not hard to adminis-

Council heard thetwater use is monitored and flagged if it is excessive.

Howard Mott, legal council for several developers in the Milton area, said the bylaw is under review, adding, "We haven't come to loggerheads with anyone. We want it to go ahead."

The reason people are haggling over newfound water and sewage treatment capacity is the Zenon project, a \$1.9 million test of filter technology which, if successful, will allow Milton to upgrade the wastewater capacity of its treatment plant. The extra capacity could allow substantial building to take place in advance of plans for a complete solution to Milton's water problem. Developers utilizing the extra capacity will pay the cost of the test in the form of a special development charge.

Letters of credit, which could eventually serve as payment for the special development charges, are due in the fall, according to Mr. Mott.

He was unable to say if at that time developers and government would be forced to come to terms if they wanted a deal to go forward.
