
On the flight line



Sign one-year deal

New town public works contract

The Town of Milton has forged an agreement for a one-year contract with unions representing public works employees.

While the contract is described as "status quo" by John Matthews, Milton's director of public works, one major addition to the agreement requires the town to provide employees with six months notice, or the equivalent in pay, in the event of a layoff resulting from contracting out work. According to Mr.

Matthews, there are very few changes from the previous contract. He said there are some caps now on health care provisions, some seniority issues were cleared up and there is a small clawback on overtime pay. He characterized the negotiations as "amicable".

Under the new agreement an employee in a work crew classification earns \$15.20 per hour while the crew chief earns \$16.22 per hour. Some shift bonuses are also in place.
