

Developers challenge new charge attached to increased water supply

The Zenon water filtration project which could spur development in Milton has sprung a leak.

Several objections regarding special development charges attached to water from the project have been filed with Minister of Municipal Affairs Al Leach.

According to Milton Mayor Gord Krantz the objections could stall the project and leave Milton high and dry for several more years until water projects in the Halton Urban Structure Plan (HUSP) are completed. Those projects are only at the concept stage.

"If Zenon doesn't go ahead in the next few months I have a sneaking suspicion that it will be two or three years before you see anything else," said Mr. Krantz. "If the region thinks it's going to cost them it's dead in the water."

Zenon Environmental of Burlington has agreed to undertake the \$1.9 million costs of construction for their water filtration technology on the Milton wastewater plant. The technology produces cleaner effluent than currently released in 16 Mile Creek, which allows for more wastewater to be processed. The Town has access to more clean water than it can treat.

If the project is successful after one year, and Halton is able to get a permit from the provincial government allowing a higher volume of wastewater processing at its plant, then Zenon will be repaid its \$1.9 million through special development charges attached to building projects which will absorb the extra capacity.

Several landowners have been contesting aspects of the special development charges. In addition, a provincial moratorium on development charges requires all changes to be approved directly by Al Leach.

"I'm not happy about the letters but this is a democracy and these developers have a right to oppose the bylaw," said Mr. Krantz. "Both the region and local councils have gone on record that new development should pay for itself."

When the issue came before regional council recently some minor changes were made to the bylaw after vigorous objection.
