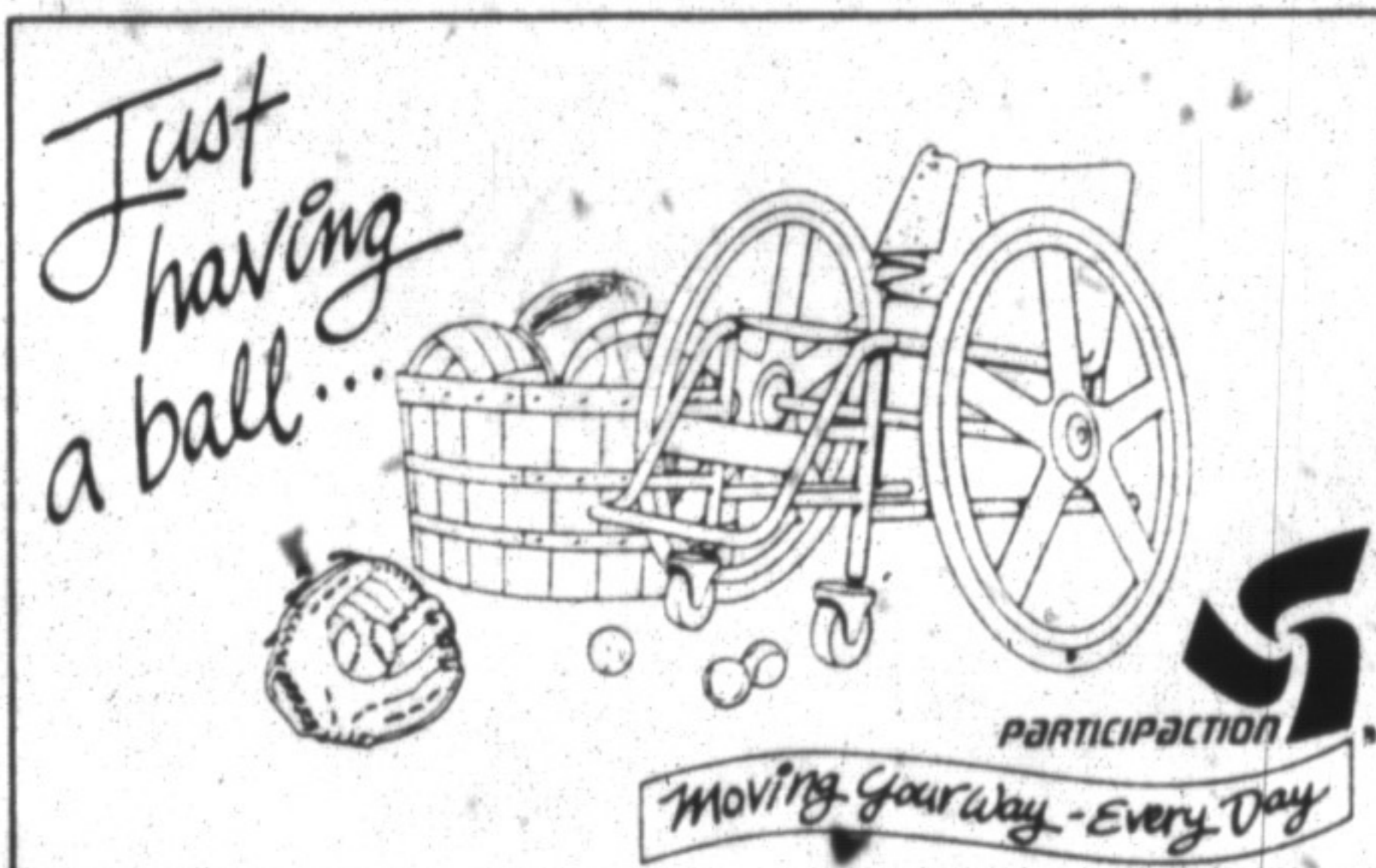

they're starting to get the hang of it. They're hitting the ball over 100 feet in the air," he said. Leworthy added that like any sport, it takes "practice, practice, practice."

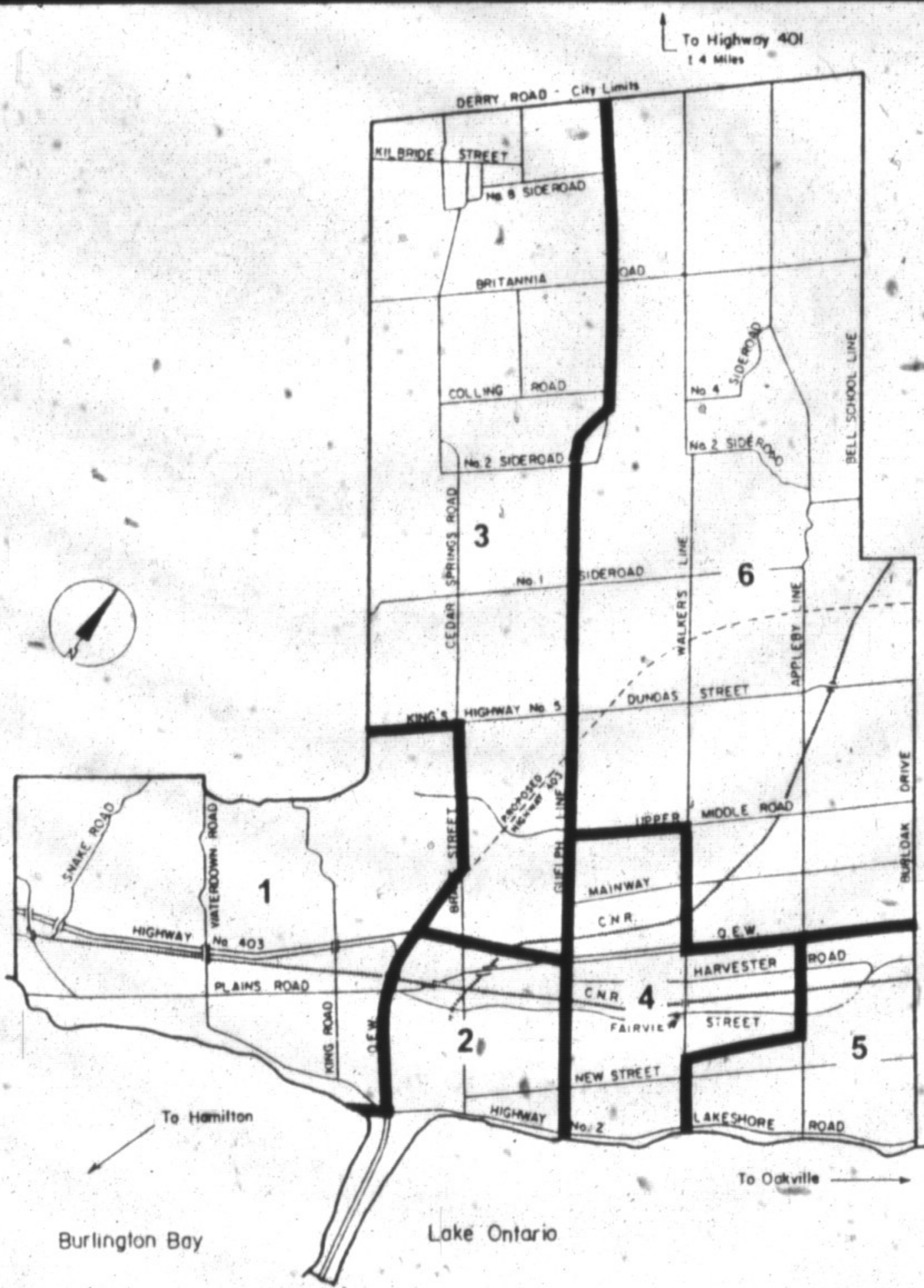
"My putting and chipping are pretty good but I still need some work on my long-distance hitting," he explained.

## NOTICE OF AN APPLICATION TO THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD BY THE CITY OF BURLINGTON FOR AN ORDER TO CHANGE WARD BOUNDARIES



TAKE NOTICE that the Corporation of the City of Burlington has applied to the Ontario Municipal Board pursuant to the provision Section 13(2) of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. M.45, as amended, for an Order approving the redivision of the City into wards in accordance with the accompanying sketch (additional copies of the proposed ward boundaries are available from the Office of the City Clerk, during regular office hours).

ANY person interested may, within twenty-one (21) days after the date of the initial Notice, which was given on August 16, 1996, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the City of Burlington notice of his or her objection to the approval of said application together with a statement of the grounds of such objection and that if a hearing is held he/she or his/her agent will attend such hearing to support such objection.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve the said application but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the application will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection and who have left with or delivered to the undersigned Clerk the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent. If no objections are received, the Ontario Municipal Board may proceed to alter or fix the boundaries in accordance with the application without holding a hearing and no further notice will be provided.

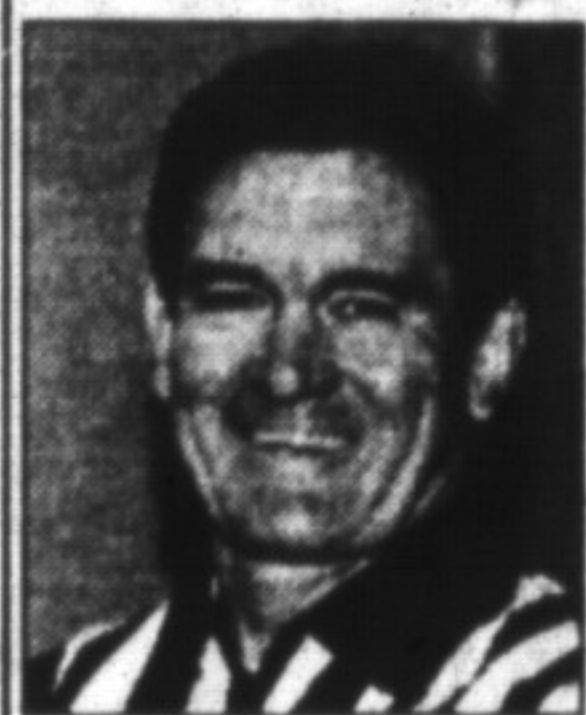

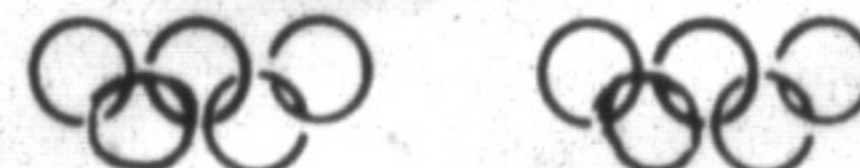
