Bad feelings likely to linger at hydro

"It was the only responsible thing the commission could do," he said.

Mr. Thorne said with no cost increases the agreement is a good one.

"I think it's a good deal for customers of Milton Hydro," he said. "It doesn't add to their costs."

The contract covers a period from October 1, 1995 to December 31, 1996, so negotiations for the next contract are not

"We could be right back in trouble again December 31," Mr. Davy said.

Also as part of the agreement, the union dropped an unfair labour practice suit it filed with the Ontario Labour Relations Board against the commission.

However, assault and theft charges against a Power Workers' Union member from another local remain before the courts.

The charges allege a picketer squeezed a management employee in a doorway and grabbed a key from her as she entered the building.

Management eventually sought a court injunction to control picketing outside the hydro building. Management was successful in limiting delays to five minutes, but failed to control the number of picketers.

The commission hired a security company and required legal assistance during the turmoil, but brought in no contract workers. Management handled the entire workload, which included two major electrical

"The vast majority of customers saw no difference in the level of service," Mr. Thorne said.

Mr. Thorne said he feels numb following the heated dispute and he's glad it's over.

"It's been a very difficult time for all of us - management staff and students," he said from his office. "I certainly feel for the people that were out there, too."

He said management is prepared to move forward and work co-operatively to implement its restructuring initiatives in January.

"We know we have to work together to put things back together," Mr. Thorne said: "I'm optimistic everyone's going to feel that way."
