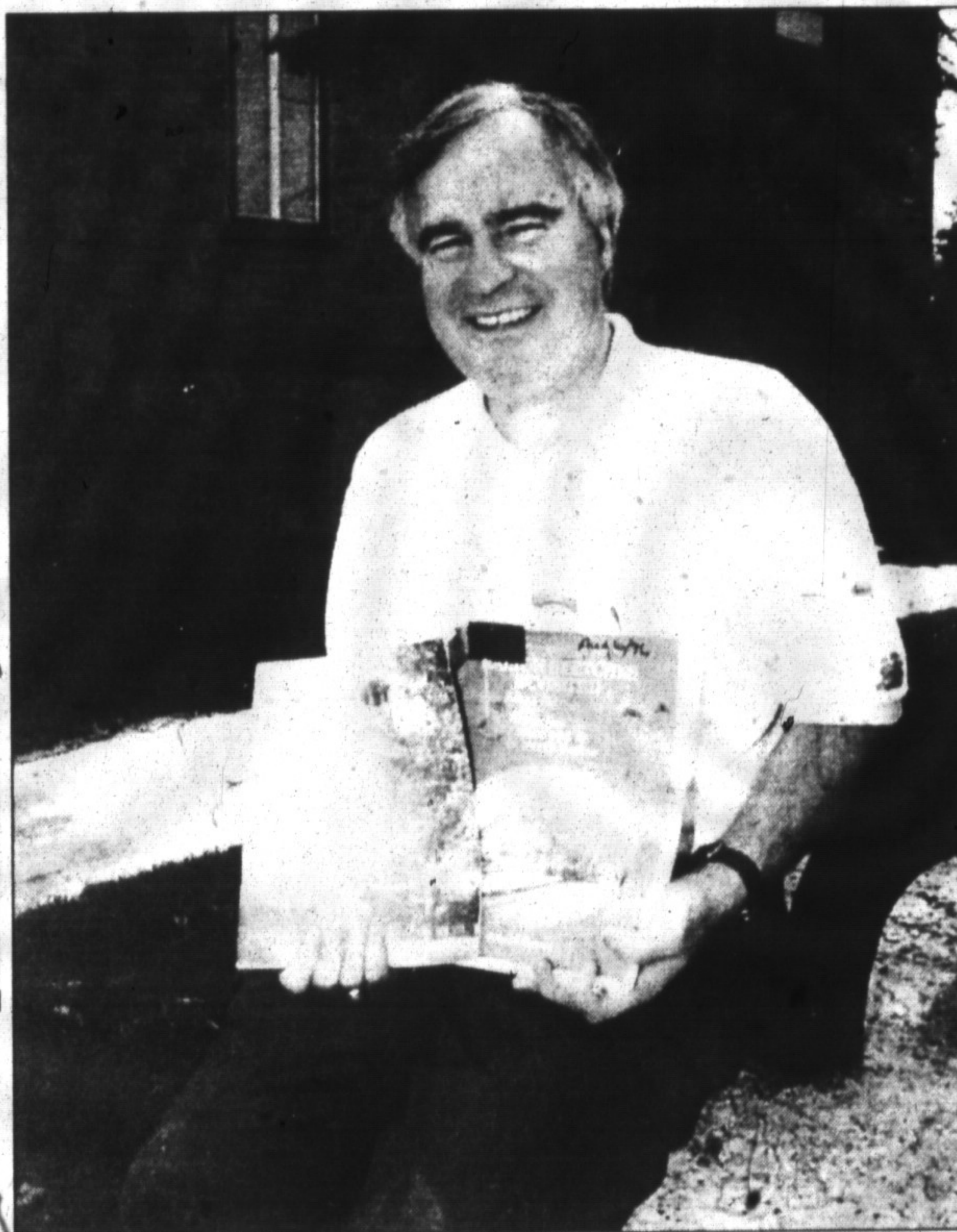

For John McDonald

Documenting past is more than a pastime

It all started with a name from the past. When Milton resident John McDonald was growing up at his rural Acton home, he was fascinated with the name Dolly Varden, a small ghost community once located on his doorstep. "As a kid I'd asked my parents and uncles about the name Dolly Varden," reminisces Mr. McDonald, "and by 1960, Acton Limestone Quarries had cleared out all traces of the community, wiping out all the buildings and the roads that had once been there."

"But the memories of those remnants still fascinated me," he continued. "And more so, the people who had lived there. By 1970, I started to research its history. I was curious to know where it got its name, and (of) the people who lived there."

Mr. McDonald expanded his search, and began collecting local history from all the surrounding areas — nearby Acton, Georgetown, Milton and the hamlets in between, in a quest to learn where those communities had originated.

He spent hours seated at the kitchen tables of old farmhouses around the township, questioning older residents about

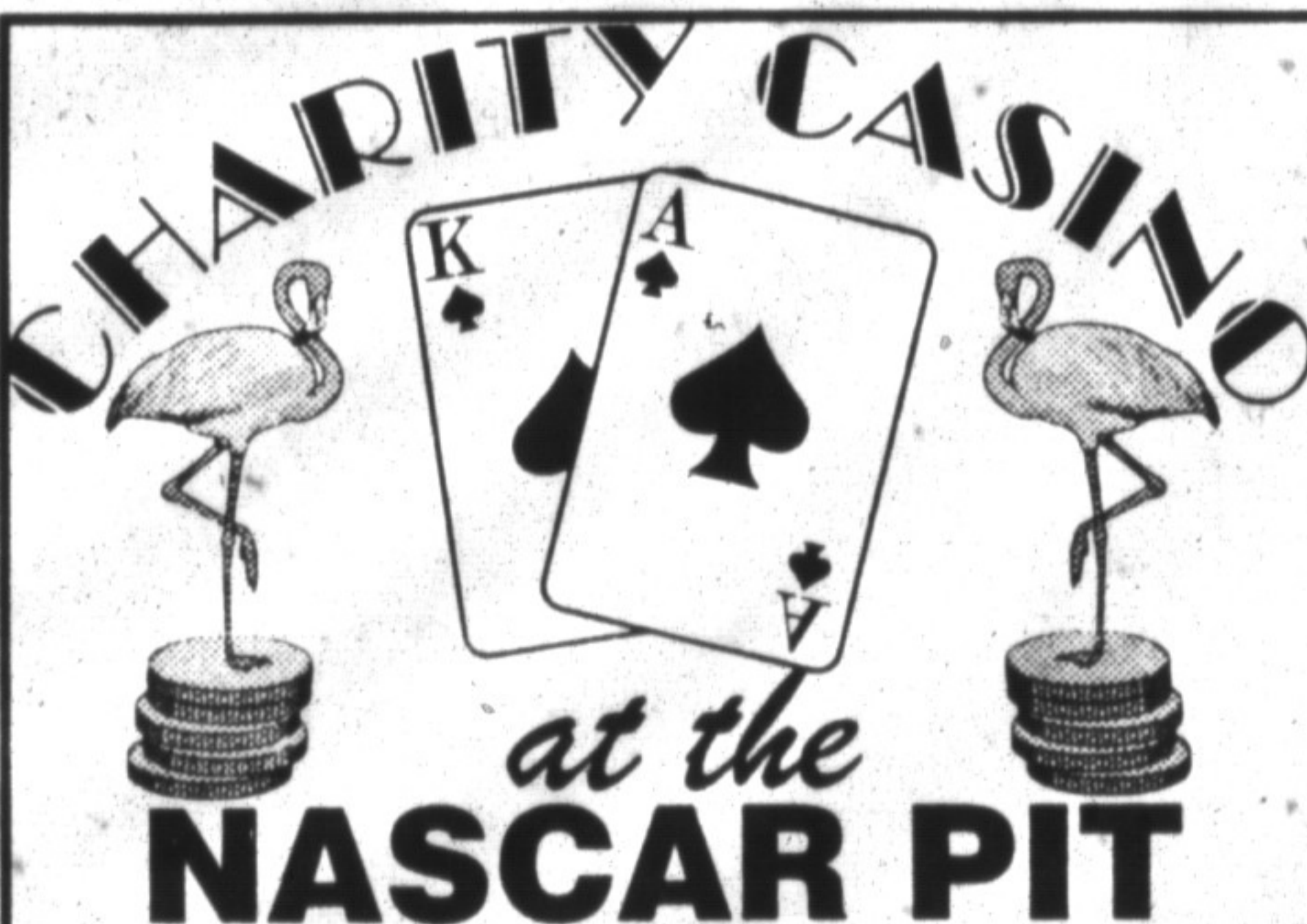
