Referring to an attached survey to canvass councillors on their priorities within the strategic plan, Milton Mayor Gord Krantz insisted the emphasis be on reducing property taxes.

"If we can reduce taxes then let's damned well do it," said Mr. Krantz.

Mr. Burke reminded committee members of the continued "managed downloading" of responsibilities from the province to municipalities. He said, despite preferences voiced by councillors, "budget allocations will be changing and reviewed many times between now and the end of the year."

"Government's are always being accused of using weasel words and putting

forward reports that are cozy," said Halton Chair Joyce Savoline.

"In Halton we've really taken a position and we are recognized for it. It must continue."

Mr. Dennison said there is a big difference between encouraging the community to accomplish certain goals and directly promoting them.

Mr. Burke said the survey is an acknowledgement that municipal government cannot do everything. He said the survey will merely point to any preferences councillors might have for spending.

The report on the strategic directions came out of a regional workshop. In the report Mr. Burke says the consensus was that current strategic directions are still valid.

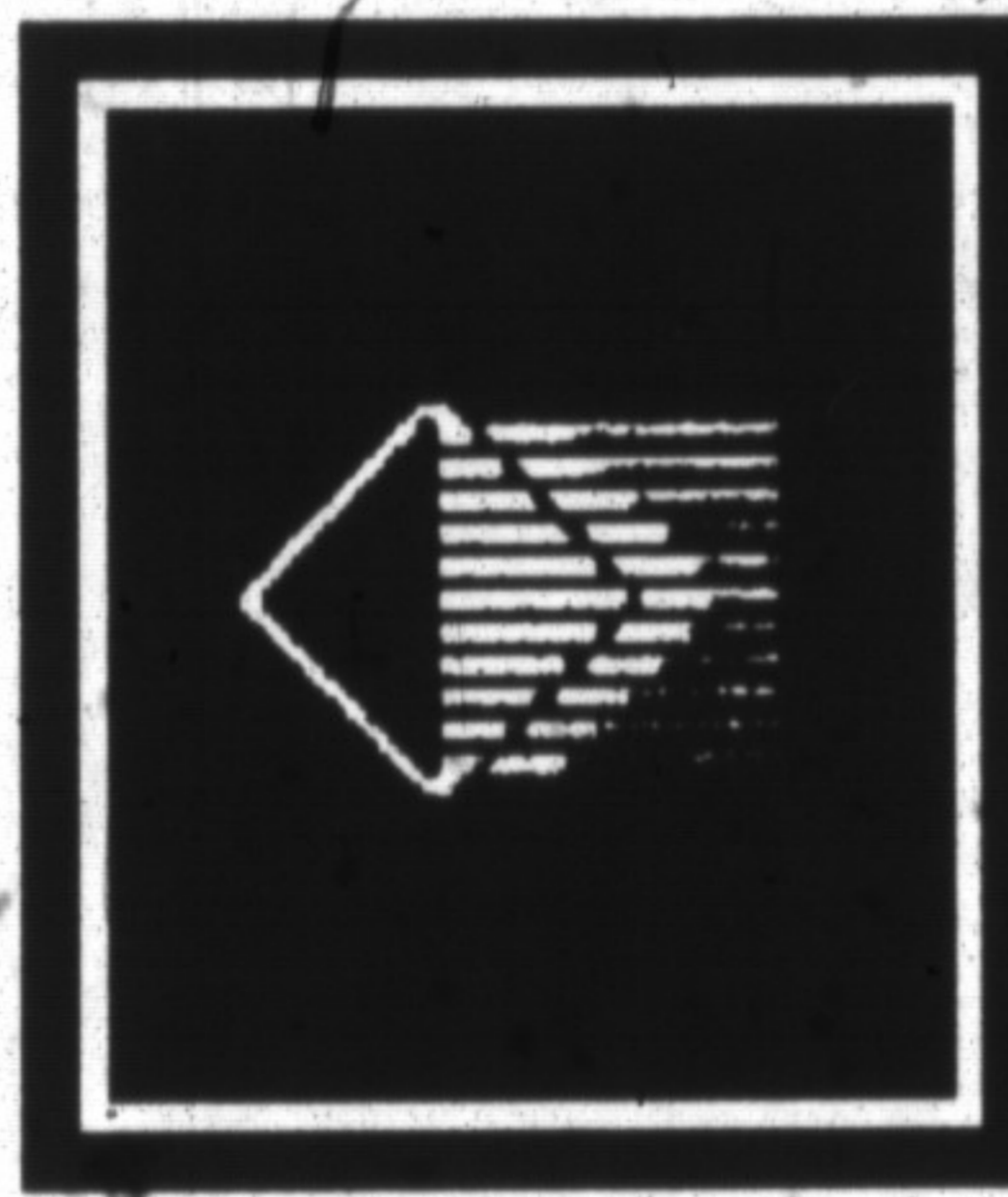
