## Catholic school brass gets 3 per cent raise from trustees

The Halton Roman Catholic School Board has granted its seven superintendents a 3 per cent pay raise.

Depending on the superintendents' salaries, which range from \$82,641 to \$99,788, the raises vary from \$1,500 to \$4,500 a year. The total cost to the school board will be \$25,000.

The raises were approved behind closed doors during an incamera session at the last board meeting.

"It's not that large, actually," said Oakville Trustee Kevin O'Connor. "We've been discussing this for some time. It's a relative compensation idea - as a supervisor of someone else, you

should be paid more than the people you supervise."

Mr. O'Connor said many principals and department heads in the Halton separate school system are reaching the maximum in their salary ranges. "You now have someone who is supervising them, making less money."

He said the superintendents' salaries had been frozen for almost five years, and they were due for a raise.

"We (the Halton Roman Catholic Board) are second from the bottom in total number of staff. We're not top-heavy with people," he added. "We accepted a system with specific ranges and they (the superintendents) can move within those ranges."

Mr. O'Connor said morale deteriorates when people's salaries are

frozen and a raise, no matter how small, is a motivator for doing a good job.

"For example, if the director has a top salary range of \$110,000 and he's not headed in that direction, then you question why the person is not doing his job," he said.

He admitted that taxpayers get upset when more public money is being paid out to people with salaries over \$80,000, and, he added, it also raises their ire when the salary negotiations take place in camera and no specific dollars and cents are disclosed in public."

"The only way around that is to let people know what the ranges are," he said. "Our practices have been not to reveal anyone's salary. None of the increases were way out of line."

## Cops want to charge \$50 for going to false alarms

Halton Region Police Service Chief. Peter Campbell has suggested charging \$50 for each false, alarm they have to answer.

Chief Campbell admitted the figure was entirely an estimate. Last year's 7,000

\$350,000. More than 95 per cent of all alarm calls end up being false due to . homeowner neglect, mistakes, or wind.

The issue will be further explored as budget deliberations continue. A formal budget document is not expected until early November, with December tagged for final approval.






