Mustangs shut out Wildcats

Stu Gilbert and Marc Polla provided an effective one-two combination on the gridiron Thursday at Milton District High School, and paced the Junior Mustangs to a 13-0 win over the White Oaks Wildcats.

Fullback Gilbert and halfback Polla ate up the field with big rushing all afternoon. Gilbert used short drives through the middle to score both touchdowns — which came in the opening three minutes and midway through the second quarter — and Polla setting up both.

A junior, Polla ran for well over 100 yards including a 25-yard gain on his first carry which put the 'Stangs deep in enemy territory just moments before Gilbert reached the end zone for the first time.

Polla broke numerous tackles for extra yardage. Handling the ball about two dozen times, he took hits from just about every Wildcat defender.

"I'm not much of a touchdown guy, I usually set them up," said Polla, a starter for the past two seasons. "I thought I played well today, after I started cutting down on the fumbles."

While Polla and Gilbert anchored the scoring efforts in their home opener, head coach Verne O'Neil said he was impressed with a number of other offensive players, including rookie halfback Mike Copeland, who made some big gains through the second half and showed grit by breaking a few tackles himself.

Also showing strongly on offense was tailback Corey Bowen.

"We've got a number of offensive weapons and we spread it around nicely today (Thursday). I thought we played pretty good," said O'Neil.

MD's defensive unit was impressive as well, particularly John Melito and Garrett George, who made key tackles all afternoon and stymied the Wildcats' reverse sweep attempts.

A number of other defenders turned in solid efforts including Brett McClure, Will Sinnott, Kevin Miller

and Greg Demery, who came up with a fumble recovery early in the second quarter before his teammates scored their second TD.

Senior 'Stangs stomped

The senior 'Stangs find themselves in a very unfamiliar situation — without a win after week two of the regular season.

Their second defeat came in a 37-0 package sent by the Nelson Lords Friday afternoon on the MD field. The senior 'Stangs have yet to put themselves on the scoreboard, having lost 23-0 to Assumption in their home opener. A number of turnovers helped Nelson mount a comfortable lead, as they built a 23-0 cushion through the first-half and spent the second-half running up the score.

Highlighting MD's lacklustre day were Mike Walsh and Jamie Comba, who each made a couple of solid punt returns and provided strong pass coverage. Comba was the only bright spot on offense as well, making a few nice carries throughout the game.

The senior 'Stangs will travel to Burlington this Friday to battle the top ranked M.M. Robinson Rams, while the juniors are at Oakville Trafalgar this afternoon (Wednesday) to take on the Devils.

Nichols tops run

Milton runner Carrie-Ann Nichols paced herself to a personal best record over 10 kilometres recently at the annual Oakville YMCA Run.

Fifteen-year-old Nichols, a sophomore at Bishop Reding Secondary School, completed the distance in 45:55 for a 53rd place finish in the overall class. Her efforts put her seventh among all female runners and first in the 15-19 ladies division.

The first-year Athletiques International Track and Field Club member came in well ahead of Mississauga Track Club member Belinda Chun (49:21) and third-place finisher Jane Kelly of Oakville, who crossed the line at 50:55.
