This carriage smokes the field

Carriage House carried on from his impressive
September 22 elimination win and romped to a six
and one-half length triumph in the \$101,720 Ontario
Sires Stakes Gold final for two-year-old colt trotters
on September 29.

Driven by trainer Bill Wellwood, the rapidly
improving son of Brisco Hanover vaulted past pace-
setter Keystone Nordic on the last turn and cruised to
the wire uncontested in a mile of 2:00.4. Image Quest
rallied from 18 lengths off the pace at the half to finish
second for driver Dave Wall, with Must B Devil third.
Mighty Beacon, the previously undefeated colt, went
off-stride leaving the starting gate to take himself out
of contention.

"Carriage House is a handy horse; he's versatile and
will improve as he goes on," said Wellwood. "It was a
fitting win for Mrs. (owner Dorothy) Revington as the
horse was bred by her late husband, my friend Leroy
Revington."

By scoring his third win in nine season starts,
Carriage House has now earned \$76,846.

For Mighty Beacon, the 4-5 betting choice, it
marked his first career loss after seven straight victo-
ries.

"Mighty Beacon just over-trotted himself leaving,"
said trainer/driver Dennis Duford. "Other than that
he's fine. He's never had the eight-hole before."

Razzle Dazzle Tom, the prohibitive 1-5 favorite,
barely broke a sweat in capturing the first division of
the Robert Stewart Stakes for two year-old filly trot-
ters on September 28.

The sensational daughter of A Go Go Lauxmont
scored her 10th win in 12 starts and saw her bankroll
soar to \$290,030 in trotting a time of 2:02.3. Yet, in
spite of the filly's success, trainer/driver Kelly
Sheppard of Dundas experimented with an equipment
change for the race.

"I wanted to try and get her to relax," said Sheppard,
who opted for an open bridle allowing Razzle Dazzle
Tom to see the action around her. "It was like night

and day. She's usually fairly aggressive as she's been
on the front end so much but tonight she only went
when I asked her to. I'm looking down the road to
relieve a little stress and this was one way to do it."
In the second division, Quebec-owned Travelin
Superlite scored her seventh win in nine starts by
holding off highly regarded Elegance by a long
neck in a 2:01.3 mile.

The pacing side of the Robert Stewart Stakes drew
three eliminations. Winners were Whenuwishupon-
astar in 1:56.2 with Steve Condren; Lobro Amazing in
1:58.1 for Bill Gale; and Ruthellenkilean in 1:58.1 for
Ken Hardy.

The finals of the Robert Stewart will be contested
this Saturday (Oct. 5).
