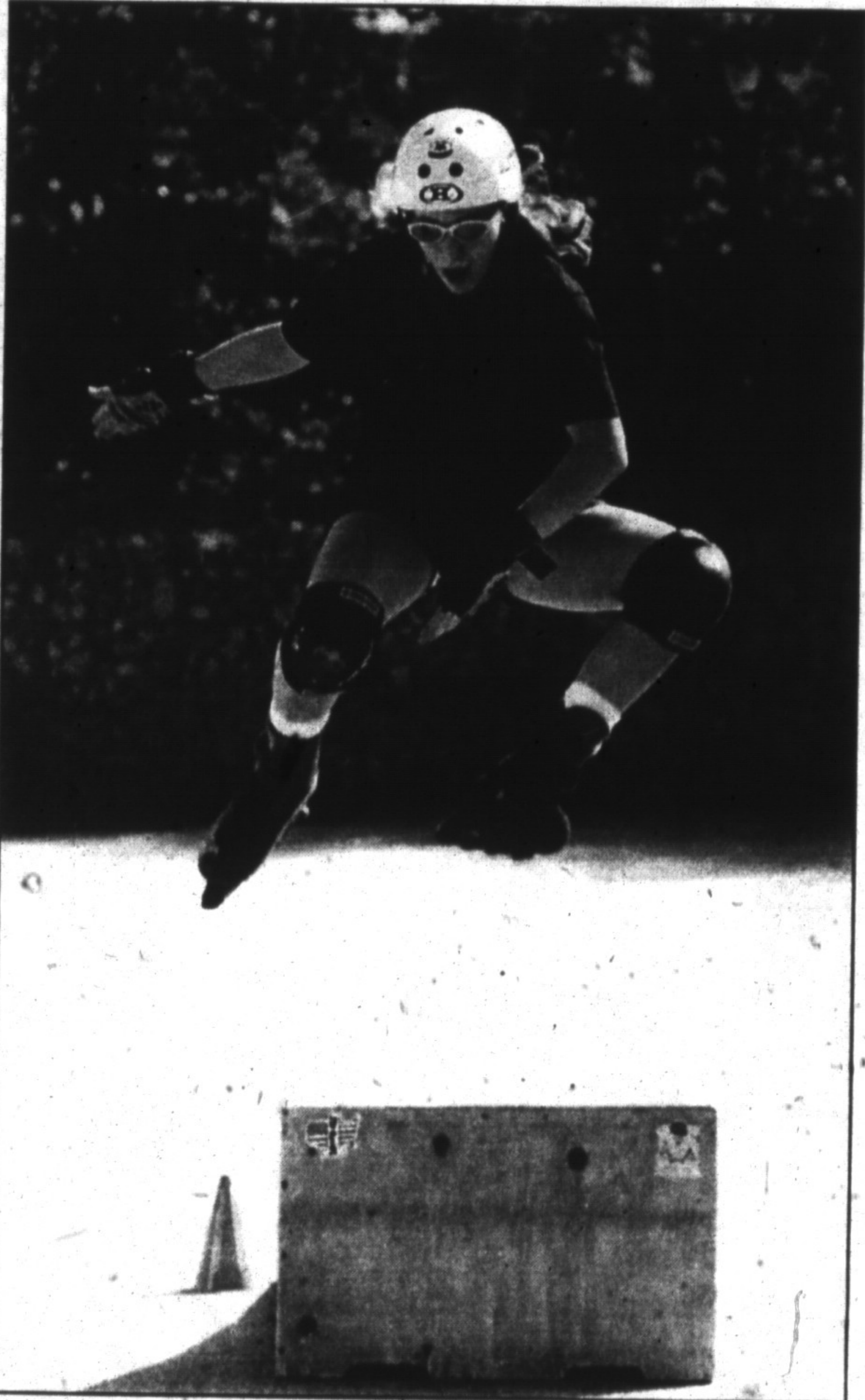

School closings unlikely says public board trustee

Closing two Milton elementary schools is an unlikely scenario in the Halton Board of Education's restructuring plan, according to a Milton trustee.

Ward 2 public school Trustee Flo Belford said board officials aren't seriously considering closing Percy W. Merry and Martin Street schools, even though the move was one of two options outlined in a study on enrolment projections to 2002.

"Basically, I think we're quite safe," she said. "People need to have their minds put at ease."

The board will host a public meeting to discuss the Accommodation Planning Document at Milton District High School Wednesday, Oct. 16.

The 7:30 p.m. event is one of six meetings being held throughout the region by the board to gather public opinion about the options presented in the document.

"It is not a final report, but rather a presentation of information, data and options that can now be examined by all stakeholders," said board Chair Linda Glover.

"This document sets the stage for discussion and input by providing all the necessary information, plus a variety of options

for the board to consider." Ms Belford said she requested a meeting in Milton after she learned the board had not planned to hold one in town.

She said board officials told her no meeting had been scheduled for Milton because school closures were unlikely.

The option to close Percy W. Merry and Martin Street schools was cited in Plan B of the document. The move is based on a proposed change in grade configuration - putting kindergarten to grade 6 in elementary schools and grade 7 to OAC in secondary schools.

In the Plan B scenario, 525 places for elementary students would be left unfilled.
