## Foxfire opponents stage mass mail campaign

Now backed by a citizen's group called PACT (Parents Against Corrupt Teaching), a Campbellville man has intensified his efforts to remove a novel from the Halton Board of Education curriculum.

Jack Huisman is leading a group of parents in opposition to Foxfire: Confessions of a Girl Gang being read in grade 12 English classes at Milton District High School.

According to Mr. Huisman, the Joyce Carol Oates novel is "pure filth" which glorifies violence and male bashing, depicts scenes of sexually explicit behavior and uses coarse language throughout.

"Ms Oates writes to the dark side of America, she even says so on her book jackets," said Mr. Huisman. "I don't know why this is being taught in our classes. The language is too much, it's seen on almost every page in the book."

Mr. Huisman's campaign to have the book removed from the classroom began in the fall of 1994, when it was first introduced at Milton District High School. Upon learning that his 17-year-old son was studying it, and reading through it himself, he immediately requested a meeting with vice-principal Barb Singleton.
