New card for liquor stores

The Liquor Control Board of Ontario is introducing a new photo ID card.

Issued to people 19 years of age or older, the new card was developed after public requests since the Ontario Photo Card was discontinued in April.

"We're taking this step to help ensure people of legal age can be more readily identified in our stores, while making it tougher for minors to buy beverage alcohol," said LCBO chair Andrew Brandt.

The card costs \$15 and is the same size as a driver's licence. It includes the holder's name, date of birth, date of issue and serial number.

"We are using the latest photo scanning technology to produce a one-piece plastic card that is next to impossible to alter," said Gary Ramsay, LCBO director of customer service and administration. "While it's also difficult to duplicate our card, we've built in a number of security fea-

tures that will enable our retail staff to spot any fakes."

The LCBO has suggested that Brewers Retail and Ontario wineries also accept the card as proof of age in their stores.

All LCBO stores carry application forms for the card. Applications can also be requested through the toll free info-line at 1-800-ONT-LCBO (668-5226).

"It takes an average of about four weeks to process an application and to mail the card to the applicant's home," said Mr. Ramsay.

"The card is an attractive alternative for young people who don't drive or who don't have a passport for identification purposes."

Applicants must provide a current photo along with a signature of a guarantor, such as a lawyer, doctor, or bank manager who can vouch for the applicant's identity, similar to passport requirements.
