of the water system, identify the source of any contamination and stop it, and "develop a proactive means of identifying problems."

According to Ms Savoline it is obvious from the letter the Ministry of Environment has no working knowledge of Milton's water system, and only a basic understanding of the minor-contamination problems which have occurred.

"The last break in the pipes occurred right on (Milton District) hospital-property," said Ms Savoline. "There is a program in place across the region to replace old and corroded pipes and we test water in Milton every day. How much more 'proactive' can you get?"

According to Ms Savoline ministry officials have never contacted Halton Region for any information on the organization of the Milton water system.

The regional chair suggested that legally Halton cannot assume responsibility for provincial standards even if so willing. She suggested Halton staff will be in touch with the ministry in an attempt to fulfil the requirements for the exemption.

Milton Mayor Gord Krantz said that many of the requirements, as they are listed, will be easy to fulfill. He agreed some clarification is necessary. "I'm disappointed. Either you allow the variance (exemption) or you don't," said Mr. Krantz. "It's double talk. It's not very professional."

Mr. Krantz said the letter may be a delaying or stalling tactic, used because the province has never dealt with this kind of request before. He was particularly incensed that it could be lost, the official explanation for the two-month delay in forwarding it.

Mr. Krantz suggested a practical approach of trying to meet the listed requirements, but pointed to the switch in legal responsibility from the province to the region as being a stumbling block.

Ms Savoline said when she prodded ministry officials for a decision earlier in the year it was evident that the legal liability issue was a major stumbling block.

Oakville Mayor Ann Mulvale accused her Burlington counterpart of trying to score political points.

"We have steered a course we are trying to row for staff and what's worse some of us are trying to frustrate and delay the process," she said. "We all have a vested interest in this working successfully. We should be working to get people working."

Mr Mulkwich said his position was simply one of observ-

ing due process and added Halton never simply writes a blank cheque for any program.

"I'm not trying to stall the process, nothing will change in the timing of the program given this amendment. Unless you pass the amendment you'll be neither steering or rowing, you'll be jumping overboard."

Mr. Mulkwich acknowledged that about 75 per cent of the Ontario Works Program's provisions are good, saying they have come out of various other government initiatives over the last 10 to 15 years.

way to determine whether a source is in Halton, explained Det. McMurrich, or anywhere in the world. Anonymous log-in sites such Finland and the Philippines only confuse the trail. "There are so many ways that information can be transported," he said.

Det. McMurrich said that, given the roadblocks, monitoring the Internet must be done in a productive way. Officers would probably have to know illegal activity originated in Halton before they launched their investigation. Merely browsing is pointless. After all, paranoia is endemic to the 'net and criminals assume anyone merely eavesdropping is a cop.

Board member Richard Szymczyk took the novel approach of asking whether the "good guys" could introduce viruses to eliminate criminal web sites. Aside from the obvious technical hurdles, Det. McMurrich said such tactics run the risk of unleashing these programs on the general public.

Considering all the impediments, Ms Roberts asked where Halton's energies should be directed. Det. McMurrich said he would like to see education for parents and their children become a priority.

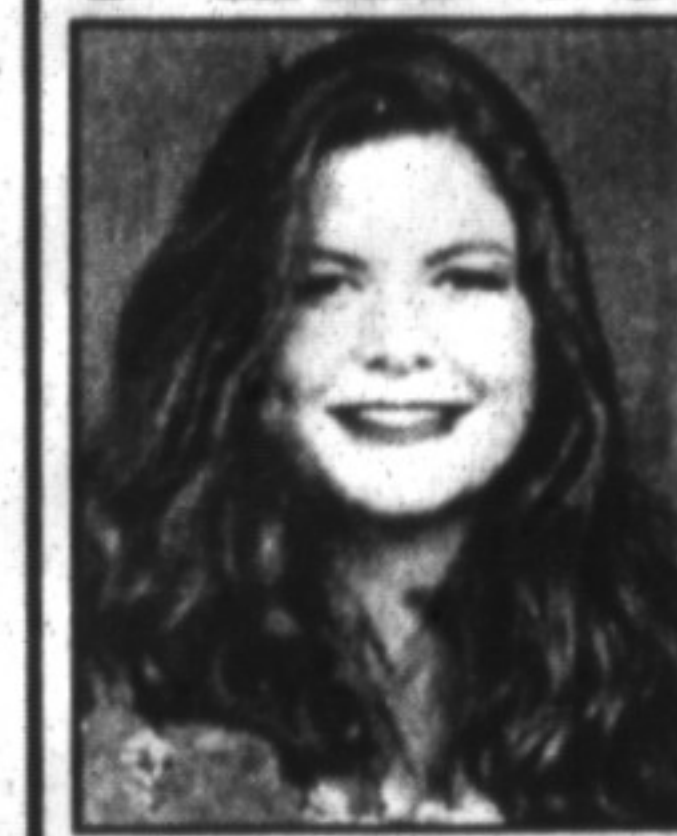
He said there are programs available to help restrict access, but even these are far from foolproof. Information sessions and workshops are now being planned through both the Roman Catholic and Halton public school boards.
