The Grand River Conservation Authority is hosting a Community Open House to discuss:

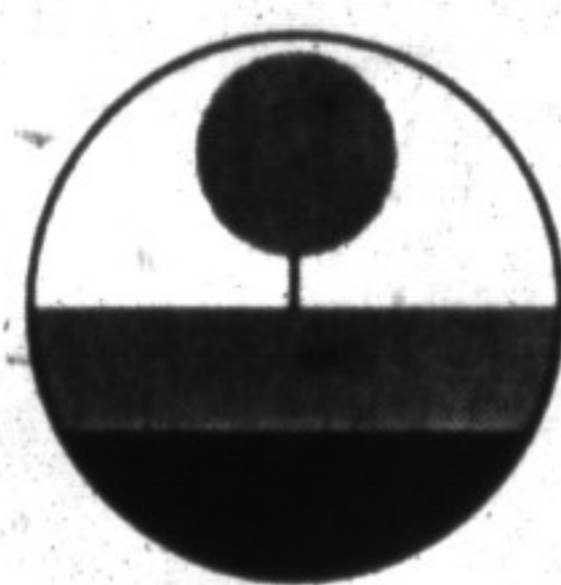

Truckers still unbeaten after beating Brampton

The Sandstone Transport AA Winterhawks' unbeaten season continued Monday night at Memorial Arena, with a 4-2 decision over Brampton.

Milton dominated the first two periods of the contest before allowing their opponents back in it with a pair of third-period goals. The home team left nothing to chance after this as Ben Wilson sealed the win with an insurance marker.

The Hawks outshot Brampton 33-18, with Blair McTrach backstopping his team to victory. Jeff Seeds tallied twice and added an assist while Luc Redditt scored once and drew two helpers.

Milton had an easier time in Burlington Saturday, dropping the Oilers 7-3. While managing just one goal in the opening frame, the Hawks opened the floodgates through the second with three goals and padded their lead with three more in the third.

Redditt and Matt Peers had two-goal efforts for the truckers with singles coming from Dan McDuffe, Jeff Mitchell and Seeds — who also drew two assists, as did Cory Leigh and Ben Wilson.

Kyle Garon earned the win in net for Milton, who is now 10-0-1 in Tri-County league play.

Laing sets personal bests

Gary Laing was the local powerhouse in the last outdoor track and field meet of 1996, with four personal records in four events at Milton District High School Saturday.

The nine-year-old Athletiques International Track and Field Club member ran the 100-metre dash in 17.9 seconds, put the shot 6.34 metres, threw the javelin 8.9m and high jumped 88 centimetres to capture four straight silver medals.

Fifteen-year-old Carrie-Ann Nichols prepared for her second provincial cross-country appearance by winning the 800m

and 1,500m events in 2:42 and 5:36.8 respectively.

She also set three personal records in the high jump (1.23m), javelin throw (8.20m) and shot put (6.53m).

Gary's seven-year-old sister Shannon established new personal bests in the 100m (17.8s) and the javelin (4.10m). She won both events.

The track club has started indoor training at Milton District High School on Wednesdays from 6-7 p.m. Anyone interested in working with the group is asked to call Bruce Burton at 827-8725.
