

New plan for chlorine fight

Halton wants to use Milton for pilot project

Halton Region wants the Ministry of Environment and Energy (MOEE) to use Milton in a pilot project" on stand-by chlorination systems.

The measure was the result of a closed door discussion at Tuesday's regional health and social services

committee and must pass next week's full council meeting. All parties involved are concerned with potential liability surrounding Milton's request for an exemption from chlorination.

In addition, the committee directed Halton Chair Joyce Savoline to respond to a letter from the province which outlined a confusing set of requirements' necessary to halt chlorination. Many of the requirements have been met, others need clarification from the province.

Milton's water has been chlorinated at low levels for about a year. Provincial standards were only brought to Milton when MOEE officials became aware of the lack of chlorine while conducting a routine inspection of equipment repairs. Chlorine kills bacteria in water and is used

throughout the world in water treatment. Colin Best, Milton's representative at the health and social services committee, said he forwarded Milton

Councillor Barry Lee's suggestion for the pilot pro-

"The Derry Road (water) line has been fixed and virtually the whole system has been upgraded," said

Mr. Best. "The problems we've had have always been in the lines. The source water has always had zero; readings (for contaminants)."

Mr. Best said the problem is really a philosophical one between those who support chlorination and those who are wary of the chemical's effects:

"We had no chlorination for 106 years and we never had an (illness) outbreak. We were always with in the

limits of the previous guidelines," said Mr. Best. "There is no comparable baseline for study so we are suggesting Milton be used as the

The few episodes of contamination in Milton have produced readings below 10 parts per billion. However, more stringent guidelines introduced a few years ago put Milton contaminant levels into what is now considered the danger

According to Mr. Best it is the changed guidelines which produced the problem of additional MOEE scrutiny for Milton.

"I have gotten more than two dozen phone calls from people who've had reactions to the chlorine in the last year," said Mr. Best, who added other local councillors

have received numerous calls as well. "There are five families I know of who moved to Milton because there was no chlorine in the water."

The measure was not without its opponents, according to Mr. Best. The vote was 4-2 with Burlington Mayor Walter Mulkewich and Burlington Councillor Bob Wood voting against. Mr. Best said he could understand their reluctance.
