

Help for parents with problem kids

Parents who make up the local chapter of The Association of Parent Support Groups (APSGO) are learning ways to deal with their acting out

Problems include kids who chronically skip classes, who are verbally abusive to their parents, who are using drugs, running with a bad crowd and are in trouble with police, among others.

Recently Roman Rockliffe or the Temagami Wilderness Centre addressed the group to explain how his organization helps parents deal with difficult children.

The centre, located an hour north of North Bay,

functions as a school, an outreach program and a place where troubled teens can get help.

The kids take a five-week course that separates them from the environment where they are in trouble, rebuilds their self-image and confidence and gives them a feeling of accomplishment.

Just one of the things that APSGO does is arrange for guest speakers like Mr. Rockliffe. The principle function of the group is self-help, with parents learning from each other on how to deal with their situations at home.


