

Stolen goods dangerous

Some articles stolen from a car in Milton in September could be extremely dangerous for the thief, and Crime Stoppers wants to help get them back to their rightful owner.

During the night of September 20, someone broke into a car parked on Coulson Avenue near Coxe Boulevard.

Among the items taken were electrical parts contained in a Rubbermaid container, hand tools in a Samsonite briefcase, two more cartons holding electrical parts and a grey case containing small amounts of chemicals.

The chemicals are the source of concern. Some of these chemicals are toxic or corrosive, and others become extremely dangerous if allowed to mix.

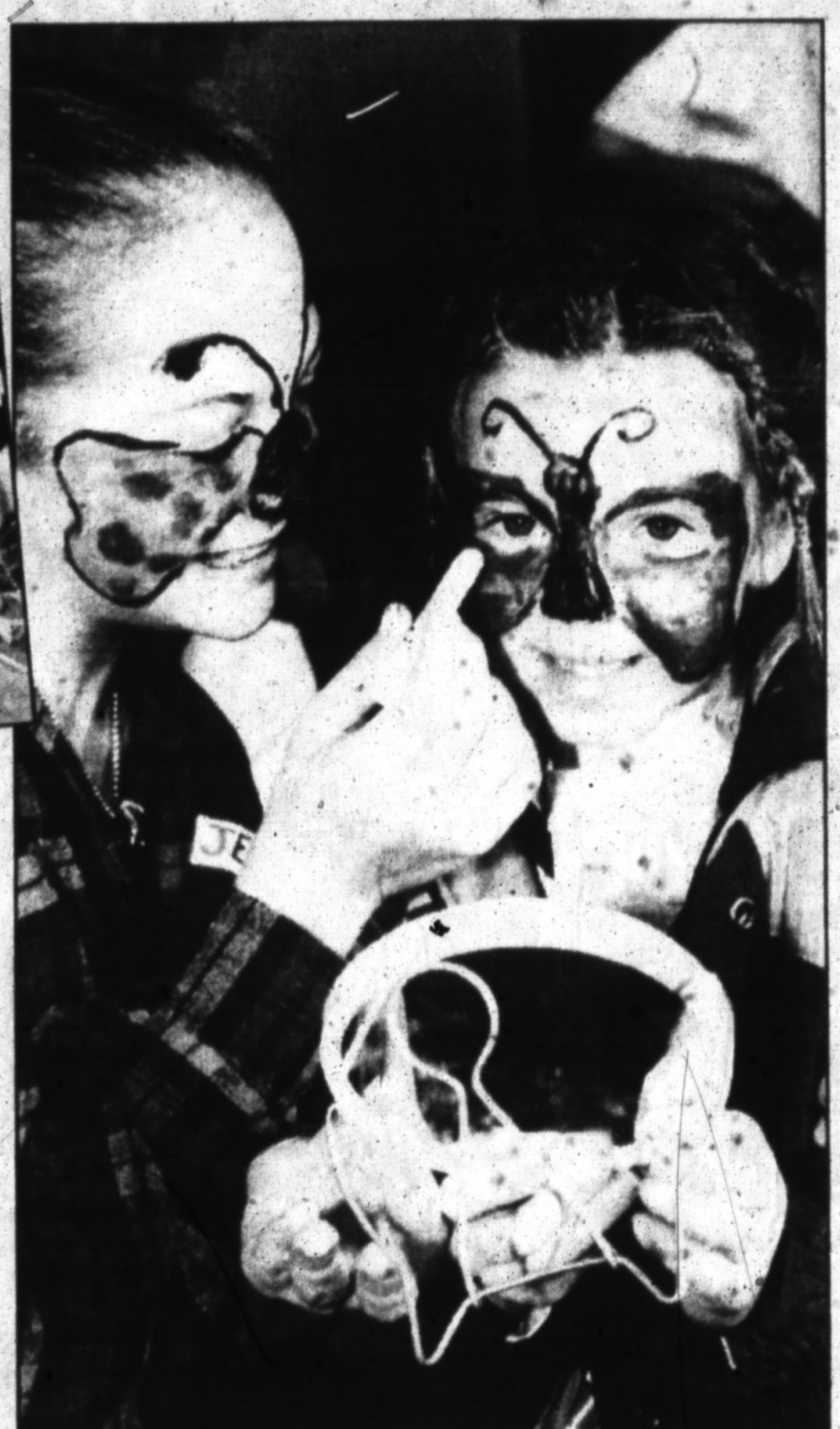
responsible for this theft, or who can tell us where the material can be found.

NOTICE OF PASSING OF ZONING BY-LAW

TAKE NOTICE THAT the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Milton passed By-law No. 88-96 on the 4th day of November, 1996 under Section 34 of The Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990, as amended.

AND TAKE NOTICE THAT any person or agency may appeal to The Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-law by filing with the Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Milton, not later than the 3rd day of December, 1996, a Notice of Appeal setting out the objection to the By-law and the reasons in support of the objection and must be accompanied by the fee required by the Ontario Municipal Board.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a zoning by-law to the Ontario Municipal Board. A notice of appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a notice of appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

The lands to which these by-laws apply are not subject to any other planning application.

LOCATION - The lands-affected are all lands in the Town of Milton.

PURPOSE

Subsection 3 (19) of By-law No. 61-85 is deleted and replaced by the following:

(19) Daylight Triangles

On corner lots, no buildings or structures, parking areas, signs or landscape vegetation higher than 0.75 metres, shall be permitted within a daylight triangle having the following dimensions:

(a) 15 metres by 15 metres at the intersection of an arterial roadway and a Provincial highway as defined in the Milton Official Plan.

(b) 10 metres by 10 metres at the intersection of two arterial roadways as defined in the Milton Official Plan.

(c) 7 metres by 7 metres if only one of the roads is an arterial roadway or a collector road as defined in the Milton Official Plan.

(d) 5 metres by 5 metres if both roadways are local and are not situated within the Central Business District as defined in the Official Plan of the Town of Milton; or

(e) 3 metres by 3 metres if the daylight triangle is at the intersection of two local roads that are situated within the Central Business District as defined in the Official Plan of the Town of Milton.

Section 2 of By-law No. 61-85 (Definitions) is amended by the addition of the definition of a "(28) Daylight Triangle".
