

New easy access OPP number

A new telephone number allows people requiring OPP service to have simplified access from anywhere in the province.

As of Tuesday, the new OPP number for police service became 1-888-310-1122. For anyone using a telephone device for the deaf (TDD/TTY) the number is 1-888-310-1133.

Calls are automatically routed to the appropriate OPP telecommunications centre.

For safety reasons, the OPP is ensuring that existing telephone and TDD/TTY numbers across the province remain active until the end of 1998.

This is to address any occasion where someone under stressful circumstances might dial one of the previous 1-800 police service numbers.

No other police service numbers will change and all will remain active.
