Haydar – He's a little big man for Merchants

Scores OT winner to lead Milton over Mississauga 7-6

He may be known as "Mini" to teammates and friends, but Merchant rookie Darren Haydar stood 10 feet tall Friday at Memorial Arena when he fired the overtime winner past Mississauga goalie.

Now locked in a first-place tie with Travis
Riggin in the team scoring race, "Mini" Haydar
answered the call of opportunity around the 90
second mark of the extra frame. He began by
undressing the Chargers' last remaining defender
and ended with a top-shelf wrist shot that beat
Pandovski on the glove side.

The local winger's efforts, which included a first period powerplay tally, preserved his team's undefeated home record, now at 10-0, and essentially kept them atop the West Conference this weekend.

While Milton skipper Marty Williamson cited big efforts from his forwards Friday night, his club has taken a significant step back defensively of

late, which is allowing teams to keep the final count much closer.

The Merchants suffered their fourth loss of the year Thursday in Brampton, with a 6-4 decision to the Capitals despite outshooting them 30-20. They managed a 5-4 triumph in Vaughan Sunday, but needed a big third period and late game winner by sniper Matt Van Arkel to beat the inferior Vipers.

Milton's record stood at 18-4-1 prior to last night's home game with Burlington.

Where "Mini" Haydar was the hero Friday, Van Arkel was the star with a pair of second-period markers and another late in the third.

Netminder John Lubera was shaky for much of the evening, allowing a couple of easy goals early in the first and two more in the final minute of the third that forced overtime. A lack of defensive assistance by Shawn Smith and Jeff McArthur didn't help matters.

Also scoring for the home side were Travis Riggin and Troy Walczak.

Fellow goalie Denver England was equally shaky the previous night in Brampton, allowing the Caps. to take 2-1 and 3-2 period leads and then pad their advantage with goals on their first two third period shots. Lubera got the call for the final 15 minutes of play and allowed one more at 16:37.

Captain Steve Clarke tallied twice, once while shorthanded, while Van Arkel and Steve French

contributed with singles. "Mini" Haydar set up their first and final goals. Earning the win over Milton with 30 saves was Caps netminder Jaime Vanek.

England suffered a second-period lapse Sunday with three goals against, but was strong overall in scoring his fifth win in a Merchant jersey. He allowed just one goal in the first and stoned the Vipers in the third.

Van Arkel's game-winner came with just 90 seconds remaining while Randy Stolec drew Milton even six minutes earlier. Clarke assisted on the winner, while French and "Mini" Haydar set up the equalizer. Supporting cast member Rich Williams put Milton on the scoreboard with his second tally this season. Riggin and Walczak once again counted singles.

Merchant notes: Sophomore winger Rich Reid was given his release early last week. While Milton's top special teams man last season, the 19-year-old had clearly lost his desire to play junior hockey. He is reported to have a baseball scholar-ship waiting in the wings The Merchants will be looking to defend their Newmarket Tournament title in just one month's time when they return for the holiday showcase, on December 27 to 30 The Merchants play the home-half of their interlocking series with East Conference Collingwood Friday.
