- Not since 1967 have we seen such a global love affair with Canada. As we look back at the years subsequent to 1967, we saw extraordinary fiscal performance in Canada. Can we expect the same? No, we can expect a whole lot more! Why? Let's look at a few facts.
- · Canadian interest rates have not been this low in over 40 years. This is not only good news for those borrowing but also those investing (see economics 101). Low interest rates inspire both corporate and consumer spending and have led to one of the greatest Canadian bond markets in years.
- A concentrated attack on government spending and deficit reduction have attracted global investors. Public sector spending leads not to enhanced quality of life for its citizens but, rather, a mortgage on its' children's futures. This also has a credible affect on Canadian bond markets.
- · A strong dollar. Even with occasional volatility (yes, it did go beneath .74 cents earlier this week) the dollar looks like the idol of the international marketplace. We could see a dollar as high as .77 cents US early in 1997. A strong dollar should lead, again, to Bank of Canada interest rate cuts (see point one).
- Enhanced productivity of the native work force. Canada is fast becoming a leader of knowledge workers versus manual labour. We are making great strides in the direction of supporting a knowledge worker environment. Quality of lifestyle, ease of access to infrastructure and significant technological tool availability are already here. There is not a day that goes by where I hear of another knowledge based business in Milton that has grown through a significant discovery, contract or joint venture agreement. We are the future

Milton, with a focused look to the needs of the future, is prime for expansion and growth and Milton business will be the beneficiary of these opportunities. My hope is that our political leaders will be more verted in their readings of Echo, Beck and Naisbett than in the political section of the Toronto Sun. With a little patience, optimism and hope we can confidently say, "Milton, the best is yet to come!"
