they will do it for us. We still have time to be proactive rather than reactive. This issue simply will not go away.

Mr. Krantz told council that the wider issue of how many municipalities in Halton will survive is still very much up in the air.

Councillor Gerry Brooks said he could not believe Milton would come out of these changes unscathed, adding the public perceives there is some economies of scale with amalgamations.

Mr. Hipgrave said the Who Does What Panel is making its final submissions on governance and taxation shortly. These are the last pieces of the puzzle prior to the
