Savoline says Halton gridlock will end

## New GTA board to co-ordinate some services

sort out their own plans, but no timetable has been announced.

Mr. Leach also announced a creation of a Greater Toronto Services Board (GTSB) that will co-ordinate user pay services across the entire GTA. There was no indication of a time frame for that restructuring. However, Durham Region chair Jim Witty told the Toronto Star that from his perspective unless the Regions do something concrete by the end of March the province will "make some pretty definite statements."

"I was under the impression they (the provincial government) were going to be satisfied with mergers of delivery of services," Mr. Witty said. "It would appear they are going to be insisting upon mergers of municipalities."

Ms Savoline admitted there has been a gridlock of action at Halton Region during the last year and a half, since the Harris Tories were elected, and promised to address municipal reform.

Please give generously to The Champion's Christmas Bureau Fund "Not knowing what reforms would be introduced, there was a lack of willingness to get on with projects that we anticipated would be addressed in this term of council," said Ms Savoline. "The responses to various reports took a lot of our resources and slowed down our progress because various initiatives became secondary."

Ms Savoline said Halton's Project Orange is a major initiative that will be put back into place now that reform has stabilized. In addition the Region will be able to address other restructuring issues. There have been talks with Peel to secure water servives for parts of north Halton.

Project Orange is a set of negotiations to form a comprehensive streamlining of services and depth of local restructuring.

Ms Savoline added there is no indication from the provincial government of a time table for additional reforms in the 905 Regions. As long as there are programs in place in York, Durham, Peel and, Halton Regions to allow for changes to take place the Halton chair thinks the province will be satisfied.

"I think Mr. Leach said it himself, there is an evolution among the Regions and we are at different stages of that evolution," said Ms Savoline. "We are not looking for dramatic change but we

Pointing to Project Orange, Ms Savoline said Halton Region has always applied pressure to itself and the removal of pressure from the province should have no effect on the speed and depth of local restructuring.

With Project Orange some responsibilities move up to the regional tier of government and others move down, she said. Halton is continuing with the Halton Urban Structure Plan (HUSP) as if nothing has changed, said Ms Savoline. However there is a Greater Toronto Services Board which will co-ordinate most things which are user pay, such as transit, water, and sewers. The GTSB will be involved in issues throughout the whole GTA area. Mr. Leach named former provincial bureaucrat Milt Farrow of Oakville to frame the terms of reference for the new coordinating body which will be in place by early spring.
