CINEMAS F Young says cost swapping good deal

Halton Centre MPP Terence Young says the newly announced education and welfare system. reforms are a good deal for municipalities.

Mr. Young, who represents southern rural Milton, noted that welfare costs are going down and educational cost have been rising.

Under reforms unveiled this week, municipalities will bear 50 per cent of the load for financing welfare but shed educational levies from the property tax rolls.

Mr. Young, a parliamentary assistant to Education Minister John Snobelen, noted the 166 boards across Ontario over the last decade have added an average of five per cent a year to residential property taxes.

The Halton board's mill rate increase for educatalks in March. tion in 1996 was 1.9 per cent. The figure has been below four per cent since 1993, but dating back to 1985 the average education tax increase in Halton has been 6.9 per cent.

"We're taking away from municipalities a major expense going up and adding a major expense

going down," said Mr. Young, referring to the switch of responsibilities: Local governments will now take on a 50 per cent share of welfare costs in their jurisdiction. "So, by 1998, I could see a savings of up to 10 per cent," in property taxes, as long as municipalities manage their affairs efficiently, he added.

Mr. Young said the actual development of a funding formula for school boards is still to come. "It will be an equal opportunity formula. A school board will only have to know how many students they'll have in September and they'll know how much money they'll get. We'll be funding students, not boards," he said.

However, he acknowledged boards with mitigating circumstances like special needs students will be factored into the funding formula.

The Halton board normally begins its budget

Mr. Young also noted, "a large portion of decision making will be given to the community", an allusion to the newly-mandated school councils which currently act as advisory bodies to their local boards.

Mr. Young said issues specifically related to the

Halton board will be dealt with at a later date. For instance, he wasn't aware of Halton's Educational Development Charges bylaw, which went into effect last summer as a means to raise capital funding for new schools via the collection of a s-r charge on newly built homes.

However, he said his government will be introducing a bill dealing with development charges.

As well, collective bargaining with education unions, which is in progress on five fronts in Halton, should continue, said Mr. Young. The Tories will be discussing the future of negotiating contracts with teachers in its spring session, he ..




