Sniper Travis Riggin shines in all-star spotlight

Merchant scores hat trick as West is best in showcase

Travis Riggin may have taken the scenic route to the Provincial Jr. A League All-Star Game, but once there made a direct beeline into the spotlight.

A trip to the East-West showcase had been a long time in coming for the 19-year-old Kincardine native, who began his Milton Merchant tenure more than half a decade ago."


