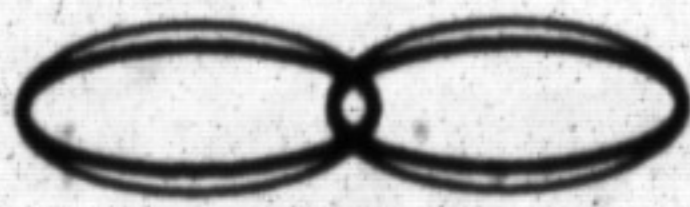

**A LOOK  
THROUGH  
THE PAST**

- Dec. 1946 - Members of the Rotary Club of Oakville, push for a Milton Chapter of men's service club.
- Jan. 1947 - Men in the Milton Community form the Rotary Club of Milton.
- Oct. 1947 - Introduce Annual Halloween Party to help keep kids off the streets.
- 1947 - Rotarians instrumental in the formation of the Milton Minor Hockey Association.
- 1951 - Rotarians purchase the land where Rotary Park is now situated; 15 acres for \$1000. The park located north of Mill St. is presently home to two baseball diamonds, tennis courts, a playground and the Rotary Splash Pad.
- 1951 - Begin hosting various groups at weekly meetings such as the annual high school graduation class. Initiate a rural/urban night to support clubs such as Dairy Herd Improvement Program and 4-H.
- 1952 - Former local businessman Ken Elsley

became the Rotary Club's first student to participate in the Adventure in Citizenship Program sending students from across Canada to Ottawa to see the government in action and meet the Prime Minister and other officials.

1954 - Installation of a wading pool at Rotary Park; built at a cost of \$1800.



1955 - Rotary Club of Georgetown established; born out of the success of the Milton Rotary Club.

1956 - International entertainer Gracie Fields performs at Milton Arend under the sponsorship of the Rotary Club. 6 inches of ice had to be removed from the arena floor to facilitate the event.



1956 - Final payment made on the purchase of Rotary Park.

1956 - A Carnival in the Park raises \$500 for the installation of lights in Rotary Park.

1956 - Former Champion serves as Milton's youngest president International.

1958 - Rotary Club approves the Milton Figure 5

1964 - New steps from Park are installed primarily through

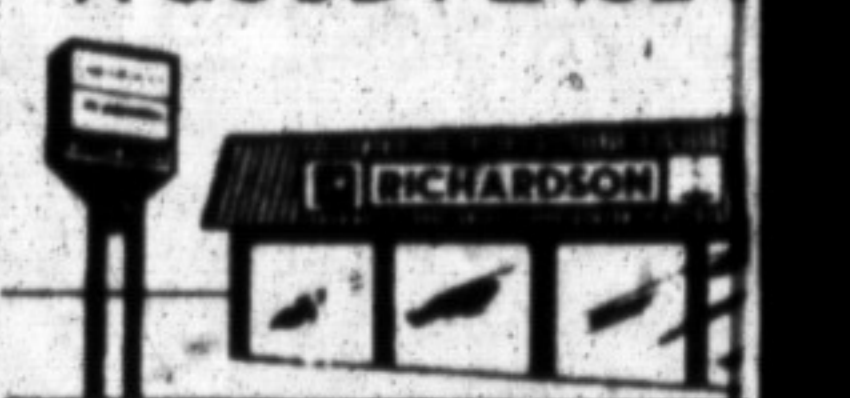
