

Police finally get new offices

A large Criminal Investigation Bureau features two taped interview rooms, one that police call a soft interview room for sensitive investigations involving children and victims of sexual assault.

"The community room is a big asset," said Insp. Gregory, one of 46 officers who moved into the new station. "I think the public deserves the same facilities that we provide in other communities.

An accident reporting area for minor collisions is located conveniently in an office accessible from the foyer.

However, funding and site problems held up construction of a new station for more than 10 years.

The new 12 Division is open Monday to Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. until February 10. when hours will be extended.

The new hours of operation as of February 10 will be 8 a.m. to midnight Monday to Friday.

An official opening ceremony for the new station will be held in the spring, said project manager Keuh Moore, a civilian Halton police employee.

Landscaping will also be done in the spring, Insp. Gregory said.




