Lyall part of record-breaking swim team

Local swimmer Garrett Lyall recently completed an outstanding short course season with the Etobicoke Swim Club.

The highlight of the fall was when he and his teammates broke the Canadian record for the 4x100 metre medley relay by almost two seconds.

Within Canada, in the 12-and-under boys division, he ended the season ranked fifth in the 100m butterfly (first in Ontario), sixth in the 200m butterfly, seventh in the 200m individual medley and 50m freestyle and 14th in 100m freestyle.

Etobicoke's relay team is also ranked first in Canada by several seconds.

Lyall recently turned 13 and performed strongly as one of the youngest competitors in the 14-andunder boys group at the Ontario Junior Provincial Championships in Ottawa. Hè placed 11th in the 200m butterfly and helped the relay team to bronze-medal finishes in two events.



Other Marlins who earned berths in the finals in Scarborough were Michelle Claessens, George Dimitrov, Jennifer Porenta, Kassandra Sliekers and Lisa Trencs. David Mondoux, Vera Semenov, Yvonne Sliekers, Stephanie Sliekers and Ashleigh Snow improved personal records and placed well.
