Milton councillor Colin Best called for a sub-committee of health and social services to shepherd the specific details.

The committee direction sailed through council with Mr. Dennison taking a more conciliatory approach.

"The only thing they changed was to look at the long-term costs," he said. "I don't have a problem with that. That's good financial management."

Mr. Dennison called the study "a strictly internal investigation" and said his position that Martin House should be maintained

and enlarged is still the council direction. He agreed the study process provides Halton with the advantage of waiting a few months to see if the provincial government's position on funding long-term-care facilities will change.

Mr. Dennison said the first priority is to keep the facilities at Allendale together. Any option to privatize could be considered at a later date, he said. Based on changes in government legislation, Mr. Dennison suggested that in 10 years Allendale could be a private facility or could be controlled by the provincial government.
