Questions linger about Tiger's role

the trial remains unexplained.
Mr. Hans, 50, who owns a palatial mansion on Peru Road and carries business cards billing himself as ambassador of Milton, was charged with conspiracy to commit fraud in connection with the Rundle Park Village project in July, 1994. But the charge was dropped five months later.
James Cornish, then the assistant Crown attorney in the case, told *The Champion* at the time that the charge was withdrawn after the wealthy wrestler made a statement to the RCMP offering an explanation.
Mr. Lundy as well as the judge in the case have questioned that decision in open court, but no further rationale has been offered.
Judge Christopher-Speyer made only passing references to Mr. Hans

in his ruling earlier this month. Yet when he gave his verdict in January, the judge said Mr. Hans lied to investors and as a witness, "was unconvincing and not forthright with the court."
He said January 16 that Mr. Hans "did everything to minimize his own responsibility in the multi-million dollar deal."
Court has heard investors were led to believe Mr. Hans had put \$500,000 into the purchase of the 178-unit townhouse complex in northeast Edmonton, but he actually only contributed \$155,000.
Victims testified they decided to participate in the deal under the impression that Mr. Hans, whom they trusted, was a principal investor.
However, Mr. Hans told *The Champion* Wednesday that he was also a victim of the scam and was

taken by Mr. Sood.
He denied ever approaching anyone to invest and said the charge against him was dropped because he proved his innocence to the RCMP.
"Talk is cheap. I have all the cheques, all the papers and all the documents," he said. "I was the biggest sucker in this project."
He said he plans to sue Brampton lawyer Ritchie Linton, who was jailed weekends for 30 days in 1995 for forgery in connection with the scam.
Investors were falsely told in a letter by Mr. Linton, former president of the Peel Law Association, that the purchase price was \$8 million, court has heard. The real figure was \$7.1 million.
The investors included retired Toronto Transit Commission employee Kulwant Gundu, 57, of

Milton, who lost \$36,000, and local obstetrician Dr. Sushil Suppal, who dropped \$120,000.
Mr. Sood, Mr. Toor and Mr. Hans planned to flip the property for \$1 million profit and divide it among themselves, court has heard.
The scheme involved selling shares to investors for \$45,000 when the actual price per unit was only \$41,000.
Court has heard investors had a chance to sell their shares in the project for \$55,000 in March, 1990, only a few months after buying them for \$45,000, but Mr. Hans wanted to hold out for better offers in the then booming market.
After the market crashed, however, the property eventually lapsed into a state of disrepair and was sold by power of sale for about \$3 million in 1994.

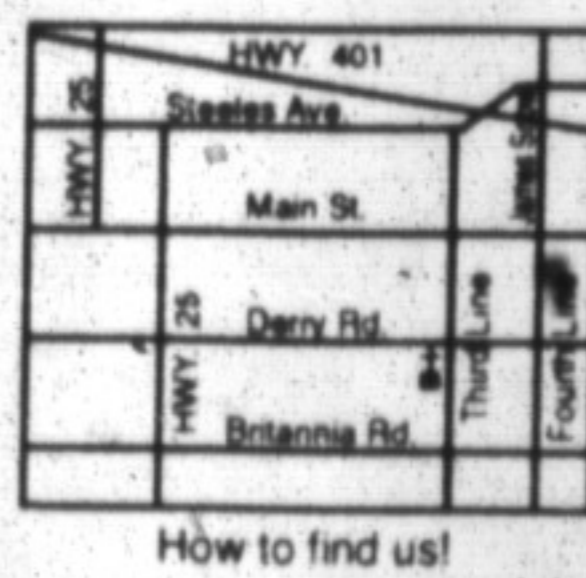
