April By now Victor has come to know Milton very well. In fact, it may be interesting to readers to know that he picked this town to settle down in over such places as Belgium and Holland.

But enough of the family history and on to the Lau philosophy of dining.

Firstly, the most important thing any restaurateur can do is make sure taste is the hallmark of the meal.

In Chinese cooking that means freshness. "Every morning I personally go and pick

out the vegetables," Mr. Lau said. "The meal must have freshness or it is not Chinese. There is a real difference which can only be made through the use of fresh

abilities. That will not be any secret to those who have been to the Tai Woo since it reopened. Dining Out Magazine went recently, and they didn't let him know until several days after they had dined there. They must have liked what they ate because Victor says "they voted me one of the 30 best (Chinese) restaurants" in the Toronto-Hamilton area.

"I think once people have been here, tried our food, and tasted the way I think (Victor does all the cooking) Chinese food should be, they will come back."

Expenditures

Regional council has approved a number of programs and expenditures.


