Halton Regional Police will be administering some very "special" attention to a case involving vandalism at an area school.

Over the past month in five separate instances, a number of windows have been smashed at Robert Baldwin Public School.

The damage to date is estimated at \$900 and though police have no suspects, Staff Sergeant Dave Eadie said he thinks the deliberate destruction may be the work of area youngsters.

Stereo Stolen

Halton Regional Police are investigating the theft of a stereo system from a vehicle belonging to a maintenance employee at Halton Centennial Manor.

Police said Jim Barna 27, told officers he was making his rounds outside of the Manor at approximately 3.10 a.m. Sunday when he suddenly observed a shadow near his car in the employees' parking lot.

He said he saw an unknown male person run away and then decided to check his 1976 Corvette.

He discovered the driver's window had been opened, a T-bar roof pryed apart and the stereo removed.

Police said no wires were cut nor was the car damaged as a result of the theft.



Earth Mover Tumbles

A 22-year-old Etobicoke man escaped serious injury when the earth mover he was driving tipped over and rolled into a ditch at a road construction project on Derry Rd. Darren Brown of Keywell Court and an employee of Williams Contracting Ltd., of Mississauga, was rescued by ambulance attendants responding to the call. The earth mover received approximately \$10,000 damage. Damage to a culvert in the ditch is estimated at the same amount.

Parking restrictions get council's nod

Milton Council has approved parking restrictions on James St. in the vicinity of Mill and Victoria Streets.

The parking ban is in response to complaints from residents concerning Rotary Park visitors who leave their cars parked at an entrance off James St.

The "no parking anytime" restrictions will affect the following locations: James St. on the east side from the north limit of Mill St. to eight metres north, on the east side from the south limit of Victoria St. to 18.5 metres south; on the west side from the north limit of Mill St. to nine metres north, on the west side from the south limit of Victoria St. to 11 metres south.

On Victoria St. it will include on the north

from the east limit to 33 metres west and on the south side from the west limit of James St. 13 metres west.

On Mill St. there will be no parking on the north side from the east limit of James St. eight metres east.

Sidewalk Repairs

The proposed priority list of sidewalk repairs for the remainder of 1984 has been approved by Milton Council.

Sixteen different areas are included in the report at a total estimated cost of \$105,435, but a budget allocation of \$55,000 will cover only the first nine items.

These include Lydia Ave from Granet Ave. to Charles St.; Robert St. from Hugh

St. to Bell St.; Bell St. from Mary St. to King St.; Miles St. from Bowes St. to Bronte St.; John St. from Bowes St. to Bell St.; Victoria St. from Rotary Park to Elizabeth St.; Mill St. from James St. to 112 metres west; intersection ramps at various locations and Woodward Ave. from Martin St. to the railway overpass bridge.

Construction is expected to begin in August.
