Flea market gets bitten

Owner Oriena Currie will be allowed to leave one of her Crawford Lumber yard buildings encroaching on Guelph Line if she makes up the cost difference for a road

The regional planning and public works committee had suggested it would drop an objection against the lumber yard being zoned for a flea market if Mrs. Currie would enter into an agreement to dedicate part of the lands for road widening.

At regional council on Wednesday, the item preceding the motion on Mrs. Currie's property was about a \$20,300 Campbellville study to look at Guelph Line and how it can be improved.

It was suggested by councillor Joan Little. and subsequently agreed to by council, that the difference between the estimated cost and what is actually in the budget should be borne by Mrs. Currie.

That difference is about \$11,300. Several councillors including Brad Clements and Bill Johnson spoke on the

issue.

Mr. Johnson said he thought the main problem (the CPR crossing) should result in the CPR picking up the shortfall.

Halton region has a new medical officer of health (MOH).


