Halton budget started

Regional staff members are going to have to start thinking about the 1985 Halton budget next month.

Councillors were told 1985 budget directions have been set, and work begins on it in early October.

In a report to the regional administration and finance committee, chief administrative officer Dennis Perlin said the increased impact of the 1985 tax supported budget over 1984 on an average regional residence should be no greater than 5.4 per cent.

He also said the increase in water and sewer rates should be no greater than 4.7 per cent.

The big, suggested increase is in the tipping fee for disposing of waste at garbage dumps. This, the CAO said, should be up to 8.3 per cent not counting the extra \$4 per ton charged for building up the energy from waste fund.

"These proposals have been based on operating and capital financial policies previously adopted or recommended," Mr. Perlin said in a report.

"No major revisions between the 1984 and 1985 budget review process is recommended."
