

Also tie Streetsville 2-2

Blades dampen Steamers enthusiasm

Through the exhibition season, observers of Milton Jr. B Steamers were wondering how the club would fair against teams from its own league.

Now they know.

After winning its first two games, Steamers got a taste of the stronger teams in the division as the club tied Streetsville Derbys 2-2 Friday and lost 5-0 to the league's powerhouse Oakville Saturday. Both games were played at Memorial Arena.

Although Steamers have no reason to hang in their heads in shame, the club played well in both outings, the early indication is that Oakville is the team to beat this year.

Blades have won their first four games and have out-scored their opponents by a 32-7 margin. With strong forwards, a well-disciplined defence and the best goalie in the league, Blades already resemble the 1981-82 Blades which lost just twice all year.

Oakville looked faultless in winning. While Steamers had a few good scoring chances, Blades' goalie Wayne Cowley, picked up from Georgetown over the summer, was steady in picking up his second shut-out of the year.

Cowley played the last years in Georgetown but was acquired only on a waiver thereby making him a "free agent" at the end of the season. He shopped his talents around

and got a taker in Oakville which has emerged as the powerhouse of the loop already. Included among its wins was an 11-0 shutout of Streetsville.

Blades scored the lone goal of the first period and then followed it up with two goals 52 seconds apart early in the second period to seal the win.

Blades added two third-period goals. Steamers had a few good scoring chances, especially for a one and a half minute span in the third period when they held a two man advantage, but Oakville's tireless penalty killing coupled with Cowley's

steady goaling held Steamers off the board.

Steamers delivered a solid effort Friday against Streetsville scoring two goals in the second period to pull out a 2-2 tie.

In a fast skating contest, Derbys pulled in front 1-0 with the only goal of the opening period.

However, six minutes into the second period, Steamers fired two goals less than a minute apart to take the lead. Ken McDonald scored the first goal from Dale Dawe and Tim Pollen. Pollen scored the go-ahead goal from Dale Dorion and Dawe.

Just two minutes into the third period, Streetsville knotted the score with a power-play tally. Strong goaling by Paolo Zulian for Milton and Mike Noonan for Derbys held both clubs scoreless the rest of the way.

Notes: Steamers travelled to Vaughan last night (Tuesday) before hosting Mimico Monarchs Friday at 8 p.m. Steamers travel to Burlington Saturday and Streetsville next Tuesday.

Among the notable absentees for Oakville Saturday was former Steamer Robin Bourbonnais who is serving a suspension for facemasking.

The club opened the season with a 5-5 tie with Sandstone. Century-21's Mullaly scored with 53 seconds left in the contest to pull out the tie.

Other scorers for Century-21 were Bob Baker with two, and Paul McCann and Duane Stark with one each.

Sandstone is reinforced with Joey Gaeton who picked up two assists. Jim Newman fired two goals while Ron Armstrong, Mike Monahan (formerly with Streetsville Derbys) and Len Coulson added one each.

The other team to undergo a major change is the new Superchoice which dropped an 11-2 score

to Straight Line Fence. Superchoice held the score to 4-2 midway through the second period before Straight Line ran away with the game with seven unanswered goals.

Eric Ellison, Bruce Ellison, Don Habbirk and Jeff Sanford fired two goals apiece for Straight Line while Billy Lyons, Terry Ellwood and Buddy Thomas netted one each.

Jamie Hume and Larry Running replied for Superchoice which has eight new players to the MHL this season.

In the other game of the night, West End Bulls gave B.W. Haggart a run for their money but came out on the short end of a 4-2 score.

Haggart Crane scored three goals before the game was seven minutes old. Bob Haggart, Dan Agar, Pat Haggart and Peter Rota scored for Haggart Crane while Mike Taylor and Ed Gaeton replied for West End.
