## Contract factfinder says teachers are well paid

Halton's high school teachers are among the best paid teachers in the province, says the provincially appointed fact finder in the Halton teachers' contract dispute.

"Halton is one of the largest school boards in the province and its teachers are among the best paid, ranking sixth among the secondary school panels," said Professor Jef-

frey Gandz in his report on the dispute. The report was made public on Friday after the teachers and the board failed to reach an agreement Thursday.

Mr. Gandz pointed out, however, that Halton lags behind on expenditures per each high school student when compared to neighboring school boards.

Halton's expenditure per student in 1983 was \$3,793, compared to Peel region's \$3,944,

Wentworth Board's \$4,230 and Hamilton's \$4,295. But that's how the Halton Board of Education has managed to keep education taxes

"In its summary of the 1984 budget," Mr. Gandz said, "the board emphasizes its fiscal responsibility by pointing out that the education taxes in Halton average only \$674 compared with the much larger average



a Special Education Advisory Committee as required by new legislation in the Province of Ontario. Local associations \* \* are invited to nominate

an official representative to the Halton Board of Education Advisory Committee for appointment by the Board. The number of local associations to be represented on this Committee may not exceed twelve.

To qualify as a representative of a local association on the Halton Board of Education's Special Education Advisory Committee, a person must be:

(a) A Canadian citizen; (b) The full age of eighteen years; (c) A resident within the area of jurisdiction of the board; and (d) A public school elector

\* \* "local association" means an association or organization of parents that operates locally within an area of jurisdiction of a board and that is affiliated with an association or organization that is not an association or organization of professional educators but that is incorporated and operates throughout Ontario to further the interests and well-being of one or more groups of exceptional children or adults.
