Wider road fears grow

Kilbride residents hoping to avoid a wider road through their community have lost another fight with regional council.

Councillors last week rejected an effort by Councillor Barry Quinn (Burlington) to have the allowance for a road through the area reduced from 30 meters to 20 meters.

A planning and public works committee recommendation to cut the road allowance width of Kilbride St. between McNiven and Panton roads was approved, however.

"The residents of Kilbride are very concerned about changing the nature of

their village," Mr. Quinn told councillors, saying many in the area would prefer to have a major road bypass their village entirely than to have the current road widened

Public works committee chairman, Ann Mulvale, noted the committee had rejected a similar effort by Mr. Quinn to reduce the width of Kilbride St.

"Unfortunately this is a case where we just can't respond as fully as the residents want," she said. "We cannot facilitate everything they would like."

Some 329,000 copies of the new directory will be delivered, beginning Jan. 24, and ending Feb. 22.

Drawings, bold-face headings, white space and symbols are used to make each section of information stand out.






